WHAT COUNCIL DID

#### Will Soon Be Calling Tenders for Highway

Tenders for resurfacing No. 7 highway through town will be called within the next two or three weeks, according to town engineer Douglas R. Wilson.

Questioned by Cr. McGilvray at Monday's council meeting, Mr. Wilson said that it is necessary to complete sidewalk and curbing work before resurfacing, and until he is sure when this will be finished, tenders cannot be asked as a contractor would have a starting date.

He estimated it will be about six weeks before paving can be started. One phase of the program which has been giving some trouble is the new sidewalk on the east side of the highway hill. It is planned to slope the sidewalk down to road level at the John St. intersection, while still allowing for driveways into properties along the hill. Cutting. down in front of Holy Cross rectory has led to the present stone retaining wall buckling at th bottom, and a new retaining wall will have to be added there.
