WHAT COUNCIL DID

Will Soon Be Calling Tenders for Highway

Tenders for resurfacing No. 7 highway through town will be called within the next two or three weeks, according to town engineer Douglas R. Wilson.

Questioned by Cr. McGilvray at Monday's council meeting, Mr. Wilson said that it is necessary to complete sidewalk and curbing work before resurfacing, and until he is sure when this will be finished, tenders cannot be asked as a contractor would have a starting date.

He estimated it will be about six weeks before paving can be started. One phase of the program which has been giving some trouble is the new sidewalk on the east side of the highway hill. It is planned to slope the sidewalk down to road level at the John St. intersection, while still allowing for driveways into properties along the hill. Cutting down in front of Holy Cross rectory has led to the present stone retaining wall buckling at the bottom, and a new retaining wall will have to be added there.

Peel Construction, Brampton, has been engaged to surface treat and oil unpaved roads in town this summer.

Complaints of waste paper blowing from the Alliance Paper Mill property onto Mountainview Rd. were left in the hands of the town engineer.

Rocco Lorusso complained that while his dog had been picked up by the dog catcher off his verandah on Victoria St., he had witnessed the humane society truck pass two dogs by the papermill that morning twice, and take no action.

"We don't want discrimination" Mayor Armstrong said, indicating that council would check and see that the inspector picks up all stray dogs.

Mr. Lorusso asked for a grant to the soccer club, and council decided to make a \$25 donation to help the team.

Representatives of King-Seagrave and LaFrance, two companies interested in selling Georgetown a new fire engine, and Fire Chief William Hyde and Deputy Chief Jack Harlow were at the meeting.

As Cr. LeRoy Dale, fire committee chairman was absent, council decided to postpone discussion on the proposed new engine until next Monday in order that Mr. Dale could state his views.
