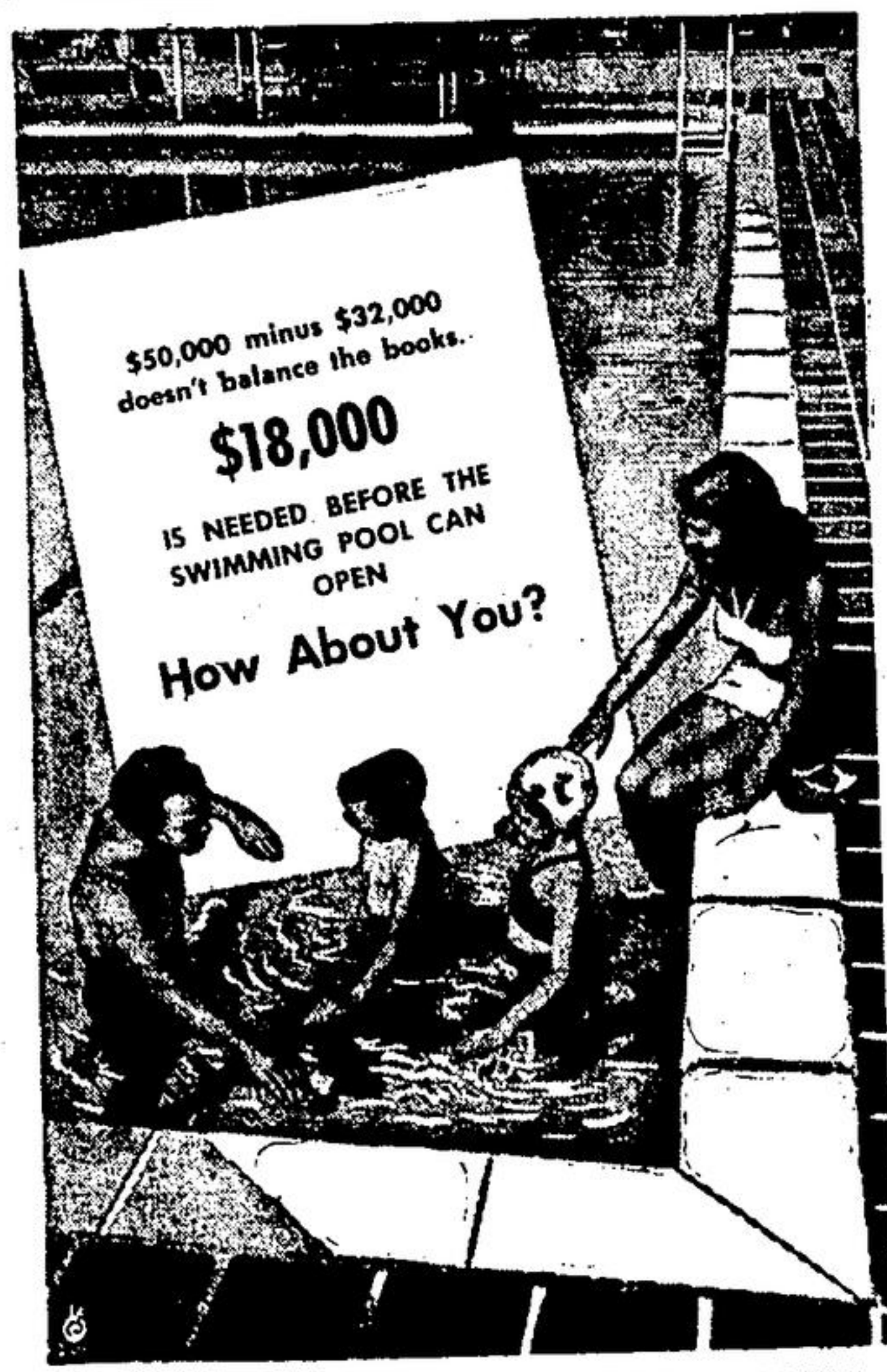
Charles S. Noble, 85 Former 5th Line Farmer

There Comes a Time

by Charles Mercer (312 p.)

Being a man who had fought and loved, Adam Brock was a realist, besides which he was a minister. Successful, he finds himself unable to preach to his fashionable New York congregation either as they would have wished, or as his heart dictated. He resigns. Chance leads him to West Fortune and here he becomes intimately involved in the lives of its inhabitants. The cobweb of human emotions woven by its people are complex but Adam Brock, by his faith and simplicity, captures the hearts (and souls) of most of them. Not only a good novel but an admirable sermon.

White Topes

by Eve Langley (250 p.)

As a vehicle for the poetic prose of author Langley, the book is admirable, but as some famous authority once observed, a novel requires a beginning, a middle and an end. White Topes lacks all these something else besides.

The Jungle Is A Woman

by Jane Dolinger (223 p.)

The exciting and readable story of the journey into the wild and unexplored jungles of the Amazon. Jane Dolinger replies to an advertisement in a Miami newspaper and finds herself the sole companion of an explorer-writer. The purpose of their trip is to find a nomadic tribe whose culture is more primitive than that of Stone-Age man.
