Earlier this year the directors signed a contract with King Shows Ltd. to supply the entire midway this year. The show has been playing many of the larger fairs and were engaged for Georgetown when it was found Stanger Shows could not meet the new date of the fair.

From this distance it looks as if Georgetown is in for another big fair attraction this fall. Spencer Wilson is this year's president, and Trevor Williams the new secretary of the Esquesing Agricultural Society.




