Injuries Fatal For Rockwood Crash Victim

Thomas Edward Gillfillan, 48, of Rockwood, died in St. Michael's Hospital, Toronto, on Friday of injuries suffered in a car accident on Highway seven on May 30.

Driver of a pick-up truck, Gillfillan was in collision with a Gray Coach Lines bus at the intersection of the highway and the Eden Mills sideroad 4 miles east of Guelph. The vehicles were both eastbound with the truck in front. The heavy bus pushed the truck along the north shoulder of the road. As there was no ditch, neither vehicle rolled over although skid marks showed they came within inches of striking a hydro pole.

Mr. Gillfillan was unconscious when taken to Guelph General Hospital by ambulance. He was later removed to St. Michael's Hospital, Toronto. He suffered a skull fracture and brain injury.

Mrs. Gillfillan, who was a passenger in the truck, also was taken to hospital and treated for cuts and abrasions.

Mr. Gillfillan is survived by his widow the former Edna Pinkney, his mother, Mrs. Thomas Gillfillan, five brothers and three sisters, George and William of Eramosa Township; James, of Hamilton; Jeffrey and Ross, of Guelph; Mrs. J. (Margaret) Hudelson; Mrs. J. (Kathleen) Doherty; and Mrs. Donald (Mary) Leal, of Peterborough.

A member of Branch 234, Canadian Legion, Mr. Gillfillan was a veteran of World War II.

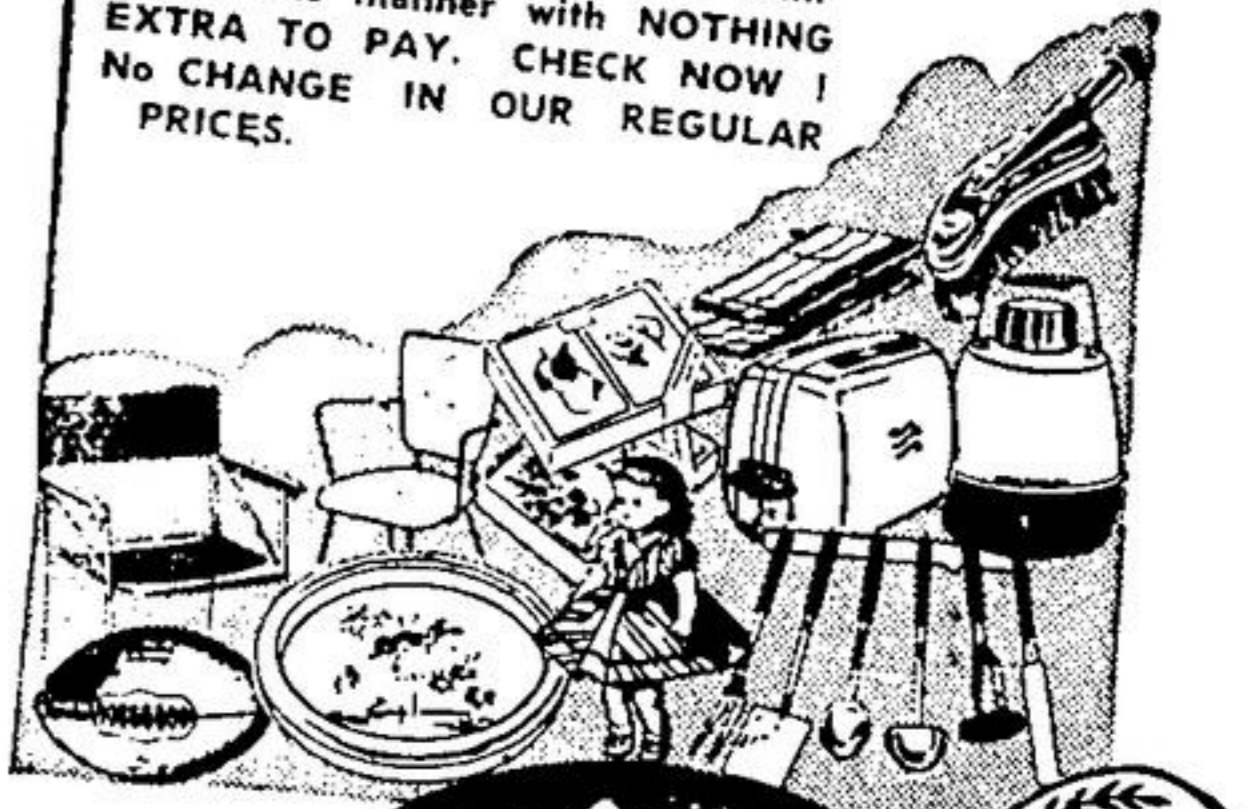
