Principal J. L. Lambert voiced the regret of the staff at her departure, and mentioned with warm appreciation her many years of faithful, conscientious teaching in the Maths. Department at GHS. Mr. Lambert stated that teachers of Miss Inman's calibre are all too rare.

Miss Inman who is a graduate of Queen's University, Kingston, taught public school for 4½ years before tak-
