Harvey Armstrong Dies Former Mayfield Farmer

Harvey Armstrong, 69, of 38 King Street East, died suddenly in Guelph General Hospital last Wednesday. Mr. Armstrong had undergone a successful operation on Monday, and death from phlebitis was unexpected and a severe shock to his family.

A farmer at Mayfield until ten years ago, he had since been employed at the A. V. Roe plant at Malton. He lived at Caledon East for two years after retiring from farming, and moved to Georgetown eight years ago.

Son of the late George and Elizabeth Laird Armstrong, he was born in Peel County where his father farmed on the 3rd Line, Chingacousy. He attended public school at Mayfield, then farmed with his father, taking over the farm after his father's death. His elder son Norman now operates the farm.

It was prominent in community life in the neighbourhood, serving as a trustee of Mayfield school, on the management board of Claude Presbyterian Church, and as a member of Peel Holstein Association. Since coming to Georgetown, he attended Knox Presbyterian Church.

Mr. Armstrong was twice married, his first wife Marion Kaake predeceasing him several years ago. Surviving him are his wife, Elizabeth Weir, three children, Norman of Inglewood; Betty, Mrs. Dick Palmer of Georgetown; and Allan of Shelburne; and eight grandchildren.

He also leaves a brother George Armstrong, Inglewood. A brother and sister predeceased him, Rev. James Armstrong, Denver, Colorado, and Miss Agnes Armstrong.

Rev. Alex Calder conducted the funeral service on Saturday at the Harold C. McClure funeral home with interment following in Greenwood Cemetery, Georgetown. Pallbearers were Cliff Found, Ivan Penfold, Don Robertson, and three nephews, George Armstrong, Toronto, Don and Harold Armstrong, Inglewood.

NEW GEORGETOWN DAIRY OPEN FOR BUSINESS FRIDAY

Irwin Noble is planning to open his new dairy plant and dairy bar on No. 7 Highway this Friday.

Finishing touches are being put on the 40 x 65 foot building this week. Of cement block and stucco construction it has a red brick front. The new dairy bar fronts the dairy plant which will operate completely on the main floor at the rear. There is a basement for storage and an upstairs apartment in which Mr. and Mrs. Noble and their three children will live.

Moving of the dairy from Main Street will introduce a new phase of business for Georgetown Dairy. Added to the products presently handled, will be butter and eggs, while the dairy bar will serve ice cream, milk shakes and sundaes along with other milk products.

Mr. Noble is advertising his Main Street property for sale. The dairy, which he purchased from Riley Brethour, and previously owned by Ed Tyers, had been operating in what was once the station for the Toronto Suburban electric railway.

The present owner took over seven years ago when he came here from Hanover where he had been employed with the Swift-Canadian Co. A native of the Arthur district, he was employed in a dairy at Orangeville before going to Hanover. He served with the RCAF during the war.

Since coming to town Mr. Noble has been a prominent civic worker. A member of the town council, this year he holds the position of property chairman. He also is active in St. George's Anglican Church, the two Masonic lodges and North Halton Golf Club.
