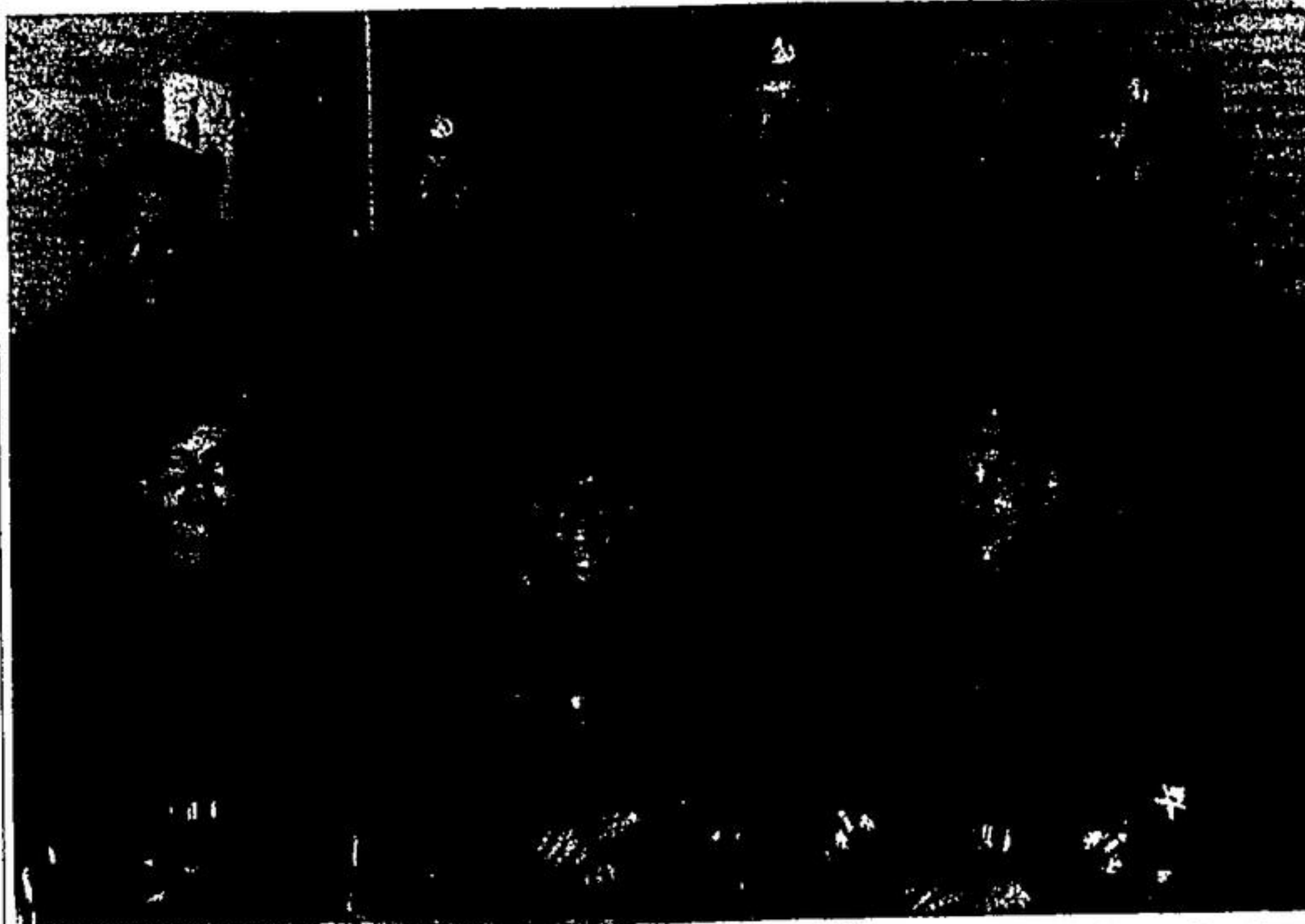

### Georgetown Cubs Attend District Cubaree in Acton

Seven cub packs set up a grand howl in Acton Saturday afternoon when 200 cubs and leaders from Erin, Milton, Georgetown and Acton paraded under a warm June sun to the park, where they competed in North Halton District's first Cubaree.

It was Milton's "Mohawk" pack, under Douglas Hill, that swept the competition, winning 72 points—30 more than the nearest runner-up. Acton B pack with 42 points, and Acton A pack with 40 points. Erin pack ran next with 34 points, tied with Milton "Iroquois" then Georgetown A pack followed with 14 points and Georgetown C pack with six points.

Before the contest events, featured by field signalling and knotting competition, the cubs formed a parade behind Acton Citizens Band at the CNR Station. From there they marched through town while local Boy Scouts handled traffic flow until the park was reached.

Field Commissioner Ron Robertson, Hamilton, led the parade. At the park a huge circle was formed and the grand howl was led by Sixer Brian Robertson of Acton. Commissioner Robertson led in the cub prayer and the flag was taken on by Bill Greenfield of Milton to complete the preliminary ceremonies.

Although first aid was organized, not one cub was taken to the hospital. Scouts assisted in policing and judging on the field.

At the conclusion of the cubaree pennants were presented to all participating packs by Commissioner Robertson. Victory pennants also went to the first, second and third place packs.

#### GAS COMPANY OFFICIAL SHOWS FILMS TO GROUP

Membership of Valley Ratepayers Association heard details of how gas can be installed, and were given information about gas appliances when H. W. Boyes, manager of natural gas sales for United Suburban Gas Co. spoke to them last Tuesday.

Mr. Boyes spoke at a meeting in Chapel Street School which was attended by a good percentage of members who live in the new Swanek subdivision and surrounding area.

He showed coloured movies of the gas line which crosses the Detroit River at Windsor, and pictures of installation of the service showed the work of the Shaw Construction Co., Sarnia, which is at present installing gas service for the company in Georgetown.

An interesting fact he brought out in his talk is that the company puts a gas line into the house at no charge to the consumer.

Earlier in the meeting, ratepayers discussed the controversial road and drainage situation in the subdivision, and a majority agreed that it is the town's responsibility to instal storm sewers to correct a bad drainage situation.

Sam Reid, association president, presided at the meeting and introduced Mr. Boyes.
