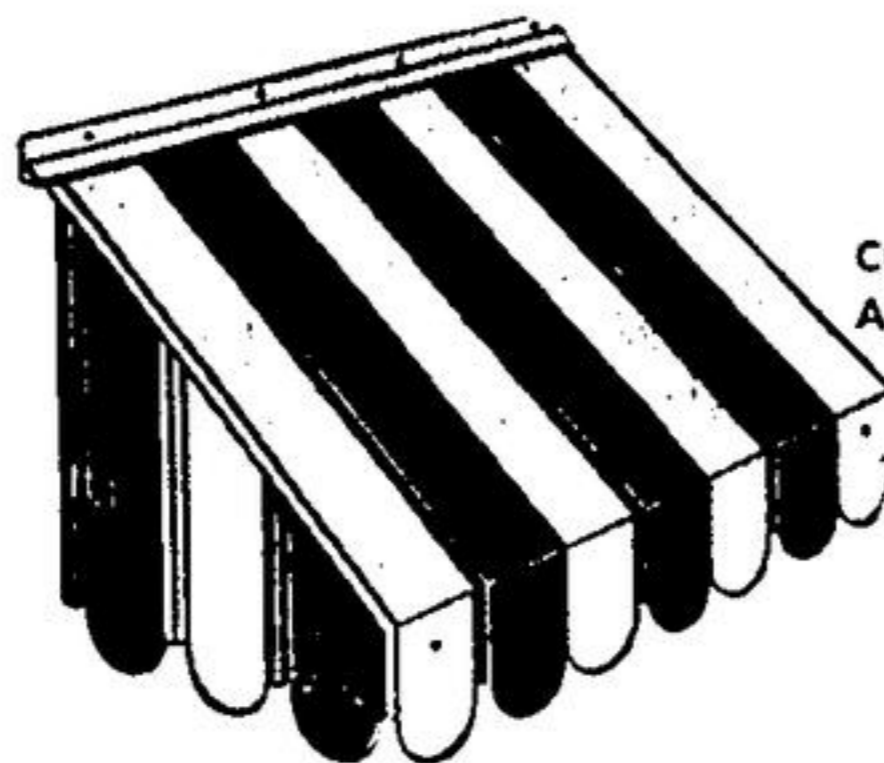

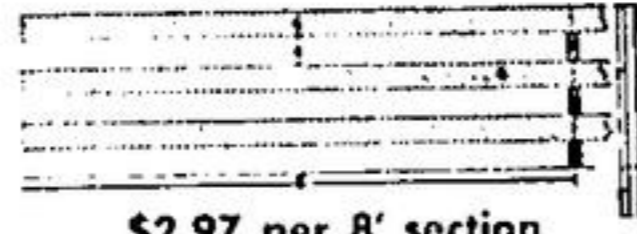

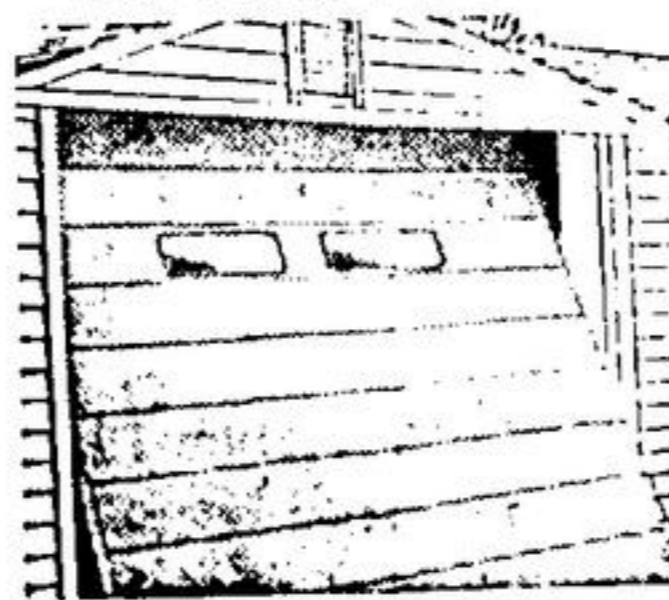

WHAT COUNCIL DID

Elevate Biltsborrow To Police Corporal

James Biltsborrow has been elevated to police corporal on Georgetown's 5-man police force. The appointment was made by council Monday at their meeting, on recommendation of Police Chief Roy Haley, and takes effect immediately.

Preparing for a future traffic light installation at the Highway-John Street corner, council asked Dept. of Highway's permission for lights. A company salesman is coming to next Monday's meeting to discuss such lights.

When councillors Alfred Sykes and LeRoy Dale said they wanted more information before deciding, a motion to join Metropolitan industrial commission was withheld a week.

The motion was made after a letter from Delrex Development asked the town to join, offering to pay cost of membership.

Cr. Sykes said he would want to know more about the commission before voting, for Georgetown is not part of metropolitan Toronto and he couldn't see Toronto sending industry here.

"I've always been taught to look a gift horse in the mouth" said Cr. Dale.

Deputy reeve Doug Sargent, who made the motion, said figures show that the commission has been advantageous to other communities. Delrex had thought it useful when promoting Rexdale and he thought council should cooperate with the company, particularly when it would cost the town no money.

"We've as much interest in getting industry here as Delrex has," said Cr. McGilvray. "I can see no argument against not joining."

"There are too many things which come up before council without us knowing anything about it," said Cr. Dale.

Town engineer Douglas Wilson reported not too much success in seeking a solution to papermill waste when he reviewed his attention to a waste disposal convention last week at Honey Harbour. The same problem exists in Michigan, and other coating mill centres, he said. At present, Provincial Paper has solved the creek dumping problem, and hoped to be able to dispose of casen by sanitary landfill. They find, however, that fill sinks through and the casen clogs up the landfill machine and he now understands the company is considering finding an old quarry somewhere to dump the residue.
