### Mamie Kennedy was Member of Old Georgetown Family

Mary A. C. Kennedy, known as "Mamie" to her friends and acquaintances, died at the Georgetown Rest Home on Saturday, July 21st after a lengthy illness.

Miss Kennedy was a member of one of Georgetown's oldest pioneering families and it will be surprising to many people who saw her so active to know that she was eighty-two years of age in April.

She was the daughter of George H. Kennedy and Margaret Walker Kennedy. With the exception of a short stay in the west, Miss Kennedy lived in Georgetown all her life, where she attended Georgetown public and high schools.

Miss Kennedy was a member of the Methodist Church before the church union and then a member of the United Church where she was very active in church work while her health permitted.

She is predeceased by her parents, a brother John Kennedy who operated a hardware store, a brother Herbert who operated a grocery business on Main Street, and a sister Maggie. Mrs. Annie Adams of Church Street, a sister, is the only surviving member of the family.

The funeral service was conducted at the Harold C. McClure Funeral Home, 34 Edith Street on Monday, July 23rd. Rev. Morgan McFarlane conducted the service.
