wedding. Guests were also present from Mattawa, Hamilton, Guelph, Limehouse, Niagara Falls, Prescott, Barrie and Campbellville.

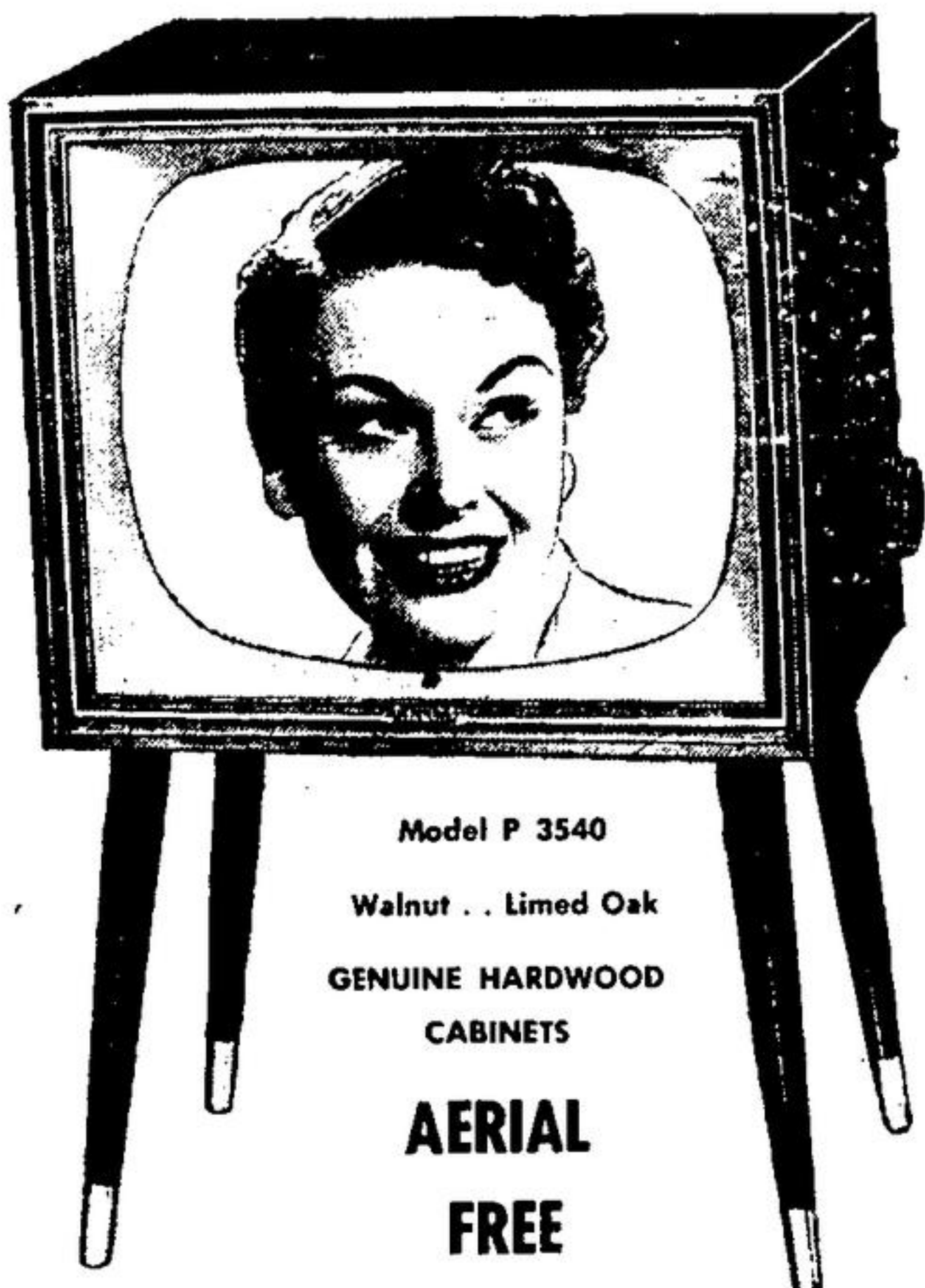
