Large Orenda Contract Means No Layoff Change

A Canadian Press release last week listed a \$9,400,000 contract award to Orenda Engines Ltd. for repair and overhaul of gas turbine engines and engine components. Avro Aircraft received a \$600,000 contract award for repair and overhaul of airframes and airframe spares. Awards were made in late June by the federal defence production department.
"Not really a contract at all," Scott Young of the Orenda public relations department defined the award, according to the Peel Gazette. "It is rather an extension of an existing contract whereby we have been repairing and overhauling RCAF engines," he said. The award might be compared to the renewal of an annual lease.
Mr. Young declared that the award would not affect present layoffs at the plant. It had been contemplated when the company had announced that some 350 employees might be laid off work. Actually less than 300 of the 5,400 personnel had been released from working.
While the amount of the present award may seem large to the average reader, it is believed that it represents in the neighbourhood of a year's work. By way of comparison it can be noted that the all-inclusive price of a CF-100 aircraft is \$700,000 and that \$10 million would barely purchase 14 such aircraft.
