Glen School Principal Taking Summer Course

Ralph McKeown, principal of Glen Williams public school, is one of 111 teachers who have registered for a summer course on School Supervision and Administration.

The course, to be held at McMaster University, Hamilton, August 13th to 24th, is sponsored by the Ontario Public School Men Teachers' Federation.

Although the school is sponsored by the 5,000 member Men Teachers' Federation, enrolment is open to all qualified teachers. Registration is made up largely of principals and prospective principals.

A Hamilton man, P. W. Diebel, principal of Robert L. Land public school has been appointed director. Assistant director is W. K. Wylie of Dundas.

Group leaders will be E. N. Fullerton, London; L. S. Hepworth, Beverley Township; E. G. Humphries, Hamilton; F. MacDonald, Port Arthur; R. L. MacLeod, Dryden; W. E. Sparks, Simcoe; and A. K. Wigg, Fonthill.

Guest lecturers during the two week period will include Dr. C. C. Goldring, Toronto; L. E. Rouse and George R. Force, public school inspectors in Hamilton; Mrs. R. G. Packard, Simcoe; Rev. J. V. Mills, Toronto; secretary of the public school trustees association of Ontario; W. B. Adams of Toronto; Professor W. J. McCallion, director of Extension at McMaster University; Professor Mark Johns of the nuclear physics department at McMaster; L. Laking, director of the Royal Botanical Gardens, Hamilton, and Norman Weir, Hamilton.

The school will be officially opened August 13th by Dr. C. A. Brown, registrar of the Dept. of Education, Toronto.

Topics to be covered will include a wide range of subjects such as "Whither Bound, Principal?" and "How Can Good Staff Morale Be Secured and Maintained?" An OPSMTP diploma will be presented at the end of the course to candidates who have given evidence of professional growth, satisfactory completion of assignments, participation in group discussion and other course activities. Plans for entertainment include an historical sites trip, picnic and visit to the Shakespearean Festival at Stratford.

CHRYSLER CORPORATION HAS NEW SECRETARY

The appointment of John H. McGivney to the position of secretary, Chrysler Corporation of Canada, Limited, was announced today by E. J. Hogan, vice president, finance.

Mr. McGivney has served as corporation legal counsel and assistant secretary during the past year. Prior to joining Chrysler of Canada last year he was associated with several leading law firms in Toronto.

Mr. McGivney was born in New York City in 1922, making him one of the youngest of Chrysler's senior executives. His family moved to Toronto while he was still a child, and he received most of his public and high school education in that city.

During the war, he served in the Middle East as a pilot attached to the Royal Air Force. He later obtained his B.A. degree from the University of Toronto. In 1950, upon graduation from Osgoode Hall, he was called to the Bar and for a number of years practised law privately and in partnership with well known legal firms of the Metropolitan Toronto area.

Mr. McGivney joined Chrysler of Canada in 1955 as legal counsel, becoming assistant secretary and an officer of the corporation in December of the same year.

He is married to the former June Haslam of Toronto. The McGivneys, who live at 32 Jefferson Blvd., have three children, Timothy 4, Deborah 2, and Heather 10 months.
