Swimming Classes Popular Mary Jones is in Charge

The Community Pool committee consider themselves very fortunate to have acquired medalist Mary Jones as a lifeguard for the new pool.

Mary is a native of Mount Forest but she swam her first strokes in an Ottawa pool at the age of six. She later received her first actual swimming lessons at Toronto.

During the last war, she served with the air force and was predominant on the air force swimming team. Her specialty is speed swimming but she also swims a free

style and is very apt at the back stroke.

Mary attended the University of Toronto for four years and graduated with her degree in physical and health education. Since then she has received the Award of Merit, the Royal Lifesaving, and Red Cross instructors' badges.

Now physical education teacher at General Amherst high school at Amherstburg, she has instructed and supervised at various pools during the summer.

The current swimming lessons being conducted by Mary each morning from 10 till noon are open to all ages with the pupils working towards their Red Cross badges.

The lessons are free and already there are over one hundred registrations. Many of the pupils were able to swim when they began the training but the lessons will be helpful in breaking them of their habits which may be hindering their speed in the water. When the swimmers have passed all the necessary tests they will become eligible for diving lessons.

In the afternoon and evening Mary is joined by lifeguard John Scholz or an assistant to see that the rules of the pool are respected.

The rules state that the pool shall be cleared of swimmers every half hour to ensure their safety.

There will be no horseplay on the cement walks bordering the pool. The walks are slippery when wet and an arm or leg could easily be injured in a fall.

The diving area shall be clear to prevent a diver from hitting anyone in the water.

There shall only be one person on the diving board at a time. Diving off the side of the board is not permitted.

Due to the lack of lights the pool is closed when the sun sets. A swim meet is being planned for the last of August and will be put on by the pupils taking swim-

ming lessons. The program will include swimming races, diving and various other water competitions.

Classes for the better swimmers are held at ten a.m., four to six, 10.30; seven to nine, 11.00; ten and up, 11.30. The list of those registered in their respective classes is as follows:
