**Mrs. J. J. Cameron, 97 Pioneer Cornwallian**

A lifelong resident of Cornwall district, Mrs. J. J. Cameron, 97, died on August 6th. She was the mother of Mrs. Ian Ritchie, 7 Orchard Blvd., Georgetown.

Mrs. Cameron, who was the former Isabella Best, was descended from pioneer Glangarry settlers on both sides of her family. She was the daughter of Valentine Best and Mary Ann Ross.

After her husband died, leaving her with a young family, she continued to operate the farm which has been in the Cameron family since it was decided by the crown. Second youngest of a family of eight children, she was the last remaining member of the family.

Surviving besides Mrs. Ritchie are two sons, J. R. Cameron of Cornwall and J. B. Cameron, Racine, Wisconsin.
