Allan Mason, of Pilborough, Sussex, England who spent a recent week-end visiting with Mr. and Mrs. Jack Gunning, 14 Charles St., is having a wonderful tour of Canada and part of the States, as a guest of the Nuffield Foundation. Mr. Mason, who is in the greenhouse business in England, was chosen to spend five months in North America, observing methods used here in his line of business. His bursary is similar to that received a few years ago by a young district farmer Mac Sprowl, who spent a similar period of time in England farming areas.

The bursaries are designed to provide exchange of information between Britain and the dominions. The recipient is expected, on his return, to disseminate information as widely as possible, by speeches, use of pictures and written articles.

Peel Hospital Head



HOWARD KRAFFT

Howard Krafft, assistant administrator at Sarnia General Hospital has been appointed as administrator of Peel Memorial Hospital. He will succeed Miss Mae Hilditch, present administrator, who has served the hospital for the past two-and-a-half years.

Mr. Krafft, first male administrator in the 32-year history of Peel Memorial Hospital, will assume his new duties about the middle of September. He joined the staff at Sarnia Hospital seven years ago and graduated from the Canadian Hospital Association course in hospital organization and management in 1953.

While at Sarnia he was actively associated with Miss R. M. Beamish, the hospital superintendent, in the construction and equipping of a \$2,500,000 expansion program.

Prior to entering the hospital field, Mr. Krafft was following a banking career. Born in Cayuga, he graduated from high school and entered the services of the Canadian Bank of Commerce in 1925. After working in Toronto, Danville, and Banford branches, he was appointed accountant of the Dresden branch in 1938. He was at the Sarnia branch for two years prior to joining the hospital staff as chief accountant and treasurer. Mr. Krafft was married to Miss Marjorie Dash of Chichester, England, and since Ontario about 20 years ago. They have a 15-year-old son, Ted.
