is owned by the person so applying and evidence of such ownership together with duplicate copies of the plans of such building and lot drawn on a scale not less than one eighth of an inch to a foot, showing the actual dimensions including radii and angles of the lot to be built upon, all buildings upon the said lot with the heights and dimensions of same, the heights and dimensions of the proposed building the disposition of the buildings upon continuous lots, and other such information as may be necessary to provide for the enforcement of this By-Law and, if such building is designed in a manner, or intended for a use not permitted within the zone concerned,

no building permit shall be issued. Right to Inspect: When the to believe that any land, building or structure is being used, built, or altered, contrary to the provisions of this By-Law, the Zoning Administrator or any employee of the Town authorized by him may at any reasonable time enter and inspect the land, building or struc-

4.18. Offences and Penalties: Every person who contravenes any of the provisions of this By-Law, or who interferes with or obstructs any person in the performance of his duties under this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$300.00 exclusive of costs for each offence, and such penalty shall be recoverable under the provisions of The Summary Convic-

tion Act. 4.19. Effective Date: This By-Law shall come into effect on the date that it is approved by the Council, subject to the Ontario Municipal Board.
