BETTY ZILIO HAS 4 BRIDAL ATTENDANTS

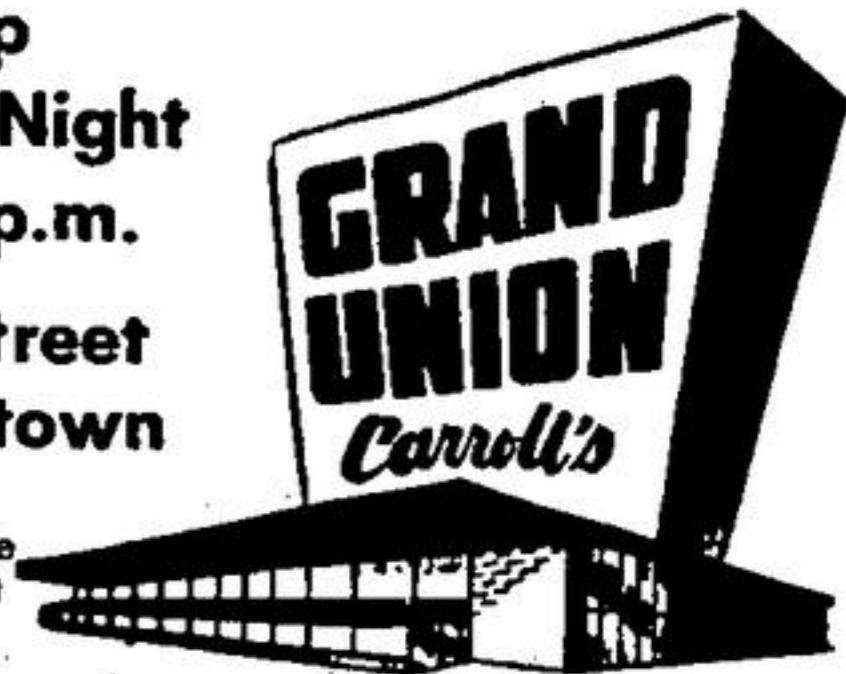
