**Malcolm T. McNabb, 68
Sudden Heart Attack**

Malcolm T. McNabb of R. R. 2, Georgetown, died very suddenly on Thursday morning, September 27. He had been talking to his sons while doing chores. They left for only a few minutes and returned to find he had suffered a fatal heart attack. He was the son of John and Annie McCallum McNabb, born in Eramosa Township, sixty-eight years ago, where he attended School No. 8, Eramosa, living in that district until '21 when he came to the present farm, the birthplace of his mother. He and Mary Jessie Young were married in 1915. Mr. McNabb was very active in community life in every phase. A member of Norval Presbyterian Church he served as an Elder for many years. He was a member of the Norval Cemetery Board, Halton Mutual Fire Insurance Board, the Plowmen's Association. He was a member of Halton Co-Op Supplies since its inception and on the board of Directors until two years ago. His hobby was his grand herd of Guernsey cattle.

He is survived by his wife, Mary Jessie Young McNabb, sons Donald, Windsor, John, Georgetown, Angus of Guelph and Fraser at home; a brother Douglas of Rockwood. He was predeceased by a brother Will a year ago. He also leaves two grandchildren.

Rev. G. Lockhart Royal conducted the funeral service at the Harold C. McClure Funeral Home on Sunday, September 30th at 2 p.m. Pall bearers were Fred Wrigglesworth, Tom Brownridge, John J. Hunter, Cliff Hunter, Frank Barnes and John Bellbody. Interment was in Rockwood Cemetery.

Mrs. McNabb has been double bereaved having lost her sister in Rockwood last week.
