FOOD and YOUR HEART

In order to test his dietary fat theory causing heart attacks, Dr. Keys investigated the consumption of fats in the U.S. He found it had increased enormously during the period that coronary disease was becoming most frequent. In 1910 Americans obtained 31.8 per cent of their calories from fats. Today the national average in the U.S. is 41 per cent.

Next the Scientist probed the situation in a long list of countries i.e. England, Italy, Japan, Finland, Spain, Sweden and South Africa. THE U.S. was found to have the fattiest diet AND the highest coronary rate — CANADA, Australia, and New Zealand came next. Then the Scandinavian countries, England and Northern Ireland. The most striking of the studies came from Japan, and South Africa. In Cape Town, South Africa, Dr. Keys and four local researchers compared diet and heart disease in Europeans, mulattoes and natives (Bantu.)

Dietary fat and heart disease was high among Europeans, intermediate in the mulattoes and low in the Bantu. In Japan the Japanese live on a diet with less than 10 per cent of calories from fat and have almost no coronary disease.
