Alfred Hyde, 83 was Rural Mail Carrier

Alfred Hyde, 83, a rural mail carrier on R. R. 3, and R. R. 1, Georgetown for many years until he retired seven years ago, died on September 30th in Sunnybrook Hospital, Toronto, where he had been ill for seven weeks.

Born at Astley, Abbot Bridge, North England, on March 10, 1873, son of Thomas and Harriet Hyde, he came to Canada in 1904. He lived in Parry Sound for a number of years before settling in Georgetown.

He was a veteran of the Boer War and served in the Imperial army for 13 years, in India, Egypt, Arabia and South Africa.

He is survived by his wife, Melina Milnes, a daughter Winnifred, Mrs. V. R. Arthurs, Toronto; three sons, William, Walter and Ernest of Georgetown; 13 grandchildren and 3 great-grandchildren. A son Carl was killed on active service in 1945 while serving overseas with the Canadian Army.

Rev. Morgan McFarlane conducted the funeral service last Tuesday at the Harold C. McClure Funeral Home. Pallbearers were two grandsons, Wm. R. (Bud) and Rodney Carl Hyde, Bill Sinclair, Joe Hall, Sr., Harry Logan and Fred Jackson. Interment was in Greenwood Cemetery, Georgetown.

"WORK BEES" IMPROVE UNITED CHURCH GROUNDS

Residents of Glen Williams have been observers of the "work bees" held during the summer at the United Church.

Unwanted trees were cut down, sawed into firewood lengths, split and piled. Litter was carted away. The whole property was raked and mowed, including the roadside ditch. The hedge was trimmed and flower beds planted and fenced.

The kitchen was improved with a new double sink, a new drain, more counter top working area and shelving and an electric range to replace the old one and the wood stove.

But the really big job was an effort to stop water coming through the basement walls. A four foot trench was dug along the north-west wall which were then thoroughly cleaned to the footing, their deep holes pointed and shaly stonework made solid again. The whole wall was then plastered and waterproofed with tar.

Last week's bees, Thursday evening and Saturday saw tile go in to drain water away from the foundation, the trench filled in, surplus earth used to fill depressions in the church yard an deavestroughs cleaned and repaired. CEYLONESE BISHOP WILL VISIT NIAGARA ANGLICANS

Archbishop W. F. Barfoot, Primate of the Anglican Church of Canada commended the attention of all Anglicans to Bishop DeMel's visit in a recent publication. He stated Anglicans will not be disappointed. Bishop DeMel is a great Anglican and Christian figure in Asia, where he is known far afield. His recent visit to Australia is another evidence of the leadership he is able to give, not merely to the Christian forces in Asia, but as well to the Church of God in the world at large. A most colourful figure in the Anglican Congress in Minneapolis, he won the respect of all present as spokesman of the Anglican communion throughout the world, but in addition the bishop is deeply interested in the Ecumenical Movement and the World Council of Churches, being particularly involved in the scholarly work of Faith and Order.

Bishop DeMel is a native of Ceylon, whose family has been Christian for four hundred years and he was educated at Royal College, in Colombo, Ceylon, and at Keble College, Oxford University, where he earned his Master of Arts degree. He is on the Central Council of the World Council of Churches. The population of Ceylon is about seven and one half million, of whom about fifty thousand belongs to the Anglican Communion.

Bishop DeMel will discuss a number of subjects while in Canada, such as: The Changing Pattern in Overseas work of the older churches of the Anglican Communion. "What is the role of the missionary in tomorrow's overseas church?" "The Rising tide of Nationalism and the resurgence of ancient faiths"
