The car, owned by Agar Guest of 5 Churchill Crescent, was being driven south on the ninth line at about 5:30 p.m. by Keith Tost, son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Tost, 32 Churchill Crescent. At a point just south of Hungry Hollow the car skidded on the untravelled portion of the gravel road and went out of control swerving from ditch to ditch several times before making a final plunge into the east ditch and rolling over on its roof. George Hall, one of the two passengers in the car, was thrown clear, landing on a fence 15 feet away. George and the other passenger, Dave Tost, were treated for multiple lacerations and bruises while Keith Tost was taken to Peel Memorial Hospital with undetermined injuries. Catastrophe Clause For Co-Op Insurers
For two successive years the Halton Co-Operative Medical Services have turned their surplus funds into catastrophe benefits for members having sickness in excess of \$1,000 in 1954 and \$500 in 1955. In recent months nine members have received cheques ranging from \$23.89 to the larger amount of \$494.37 to a member who had expenses totalling over \$2,000. In the near future it will be possible for members to take out a Catastrophe contract covering costs up to \$5,000. Statistics show that the average family are only "half insured" even if they have the best coverage offered. Most people can budget for short time illnesses but are not prepared for excessive costs that a serious accident or chronic illness can involve. The Catastrophe contract will have a \$500 deductible clause because most of the first \$500 is usually covered by the co-operative's hospital and surgical contract. Although private insurance companies are offering a catastrophe plan and many co-operatives in the USA have the plan underway, the Ontario Medical Services Federation is the only Canadian co-operative group so far which has arranged for a catastrophe policy for its members.
