**FARM FORUMS SUGGEST
SCHOOL MILK SUPPLIED**

Should farmers invest in Marketing? was the subject discussed on National Farm Radio Forum on Monday evening, November 5th. All forum groups in Halton agreed there is room for considerable improvement in the Marketing of farm produce. Some groups mentioned different commodities that show too wide a spread between the price received by producer and price consumer pays. The second question was "would investment by farmers help, and if so, how should it be done." The majority of the groups felt if farmers had money invested it would help as they would take more interest in marketing their produce. One group thought with so much money invested in equipment it shouldn't be necessary to invest in and support farm markets. Most of the groups recommended investment in local cooperatives while others were divided on this suggestion.

Fatima Statue Pays Georgetown Visit

Most people, Roman Catholic and non-Roman Catholic alike, recall the movie entitled "The Miracle of Fatima" produced in September, 1952, and since that time seen by millions all over the world. For eight years, statues, carved to bring out as closely as possible what the Mother of Christ looked like in the apparitions of Fatima in 1917, have been taken from here and carried by land, sea and air to be used as an object lesson and bring her message to the world. That important message is to beg God's mercy and peace through the penance of living good lives and through daily prayer. Father P. Moore of the Scarborough Mission Society, Toronto, visited Georgetown with one of these statues on November 7th - 8th. A motorcade of about 30 cars met the Ave Maria van at Silvercreek. The statue was brought to the Holy Cross Church, while people answered the Rosary said by Father Moore through the loud-speakers. On arrival, it was placed on a carrier. Four men carried it within the Church, preceded by two children, a boy with the rosary and a girl with the crown. In the meanwhile, hymns were sung by the choir in honour of our Lady. After the crowning, Very Rev. Father Thomas Van Laer, DDOFM, Cap., pastor of the parish welcomed Father Moore, at the same time stressing the necessity of this special Crusade in view of the menace of war. Again a Rosary was said and Father Moore preached an eloquent sermon on the message of our Lady of Fatima. After the benediction, he gave the blessing of our Lady to the adults and the children. On Thursday, November 8th, many people came to pray before the statue and in the evening, it was carried to Milton, accompanied once more by a motorcade of cars from Georgetown.
