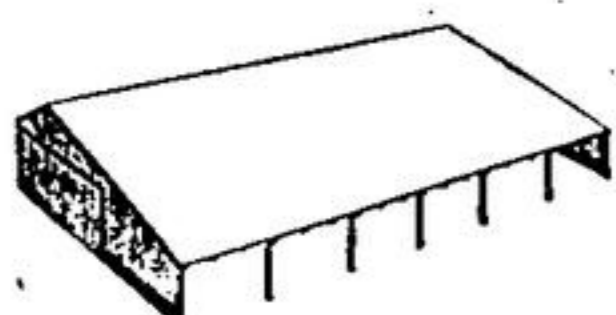

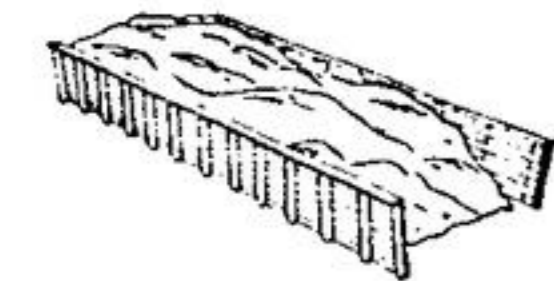

**Workman Collapses, Dies
At Smith & Stone Plant**

Smith and Stone workers were shocked Wednesday when word spread through the plant that one of the men on the Wolfand Construction crew, contractors for the new building, had suffered a heart seizure and died while at his work.

George Roberts, age 66, Guelph, was working on the wall of the building when he took the attack. Nurses from the main plant rushed to his assistance but were unable to help as he died within minutes.

Since he came to town with the company, Mr. Roberts had become popular with many of the Smith & Stone employees. Born in Elora, he had been a resident of Guelph since 1918.

He is survived by his wife Ethel Ryder, and eight brothers and one sister, Hugh, Elora; Lloyd, Toronto; Jack, Windsor; Harry, Fergus; Llewellyn Elmira; Milton, Guelph; Charles, Elora; Mrs. Carl Woolis, Elora, and Lorne, Toronto.

Mr. and Mrs. Walter Gray, 6 Church Street, were in Toronto yesterday to attend the funeral of Mr. Gray's cousin William Stinson who died suddenly on Sunday.

A retired CPR employee, Mr. Stinson was a native of Orangeville. He served overseas with the Queen's Own Rifles in the first world war, going overseas with the 1st contingent and serving under a former Georgetown Col. D. H. C. Mason.

His wife died last year, and he leaves two daughters Betty and Kathleen and one brother Roy, all of Toronto.
