**M. C. Winner, Ex-Postmaster Has Impressive Military Funeral**

Georgetown's postmaster from 1940 to 1955, and a former commanding officer of the Lorne Rifles Scottish (now the Lorne Scots), Lt. Col. Gordon B. S. Cousens was buried in Greenwood Cemetery with full military honours last Wednesday.

He died suddenly in Guelph General Hospital on November 12th.

Operator of a fur farm at Barrie and later at Georgetown, Colonel Cousens was born in India where his father was an archeological surveyor in the British government service. He was educated in Scotland and at Glasgow University.

Joining the Royal Artillery at the outbreak of World War I, he served throughout that conflict and for a year with the occupation army in Germany. He won the Military Cross during battle action, was at one time an acting brigadier, and left army service with the rank of major.

He spent three years in government service in China, and in 1923 came to Canada and was employed in Toronto for two years. He returned to England in 1925 where he married Dorothy Middleton, and in 1925 they came to Canada to

live at Barrie. In 1927 they moved to Georgetown, establishing a fur farm on the Check Line which he operated until he became postmaster. On retirement a year ago, he was succeeded in that position by Harold Marshall.

Active in the formation of Branch 120, Canadian Legion Colonel Cousens served as first president, and maintained his interest in the branch as a member of the Poppy Fund committee and the Board of Trustees. He joined the Halton Rifles a quarter century ago, and took command when it became the Lorne Rifles Scottish in 1931, continuing in this post for five years. He was a past president of the Imperial Officers Association and member of St. George's Anglican Church.

Surviving are his wife; four children, Barbara, (Mrs. K. Duncan), Georgetown, Pamela (Mrs. E. S. Rutter), Willowdale, George, with the RCMP, stationed in Ottawa, and Colin with the Ontario Provincial Police at Virginiatown; 9 grandchildren; a brother Harry Cousens of Oxted, England; and two sisters in England, Mrs. Mysie Tugwell, Bedford, and Mrs. George Everett, Guilford.

The Canadian Legion, Branch 120, held a service at the McClure Funeral Home, the night before, with Rev. Kenneth Richardson, the branch padre, officiating. Some fifty of his comrades were present.

Rev. Kenneth Richardson, padre of Branch 120, conducted the funeral service in St. George's Anglican. He was assisted by H./Capt. Alex Calder, Lorne Scots chaplain, and Canon Barnett, padre of the Imperial Officers association.

The funeral cortege from the church to Greenwood Cemetery included members of the Lorne Scots, commanded by Major Arthur Kemp. The insignia bearer was Lt. G. F. Millar, Brampton, and Legion members RSM Henry Shepherd and Fred McCartney were wreath bearers. The Lorne Scots pipe band,



commanded by Pipe Major Sellers were led by drum major Finlay McCallum, and the gun carriage was driven by members of the RCASC No. 2 Coy.

Bandsman Charles Lonsborough, Acton, sounded Last Post and Reveille at the graveside after three volleys in honour of Georgetown's soldier-citizen. Sgt. Major Harry Walker commanded the firing party. Lorne Scots sergeants served as pallbearers, Bruce Harley, Jim Brandford, Bill Hardman, Pat Chamberlain, Gary Dawkins, John Michie, John Doherty, and Eric Timms. Sgt. Major Ken Murray was in charge.

Lt. Col. S. R. Charters, CD, Brampton, regimental commanding officer was an honorary pallbearer, as were eight former C.O.'s, Lt. Col. E. Pullen, Oakville, Col. R. V. E. Conover, Brampton, and Lt. Col. L. Bertram, Snelgrove. C. M. Corbett, Brampton, Gordon Brown, of Georgetown, C. T. Sharpe, Erindale, F. H. Chisholm, Oakville and John R. Barber, Georgetown.
