## Sneak Thief Enters Five Local Homes

Five homes were broken into last Friday evening while the residents were out doing their week-end shopping. The prowler made the entries between 6 and 9 p.m. being very careful to pick only those houses which were in total darkness.

The houses entered were those of Doug Peck, 45 Normandy Blvd., David Hall, 43 Norton Cres., A. G. McMaster, 20 Baird Cres., Harrison Wood, 40 Baird Cres. and Bob Caldwell, 10 Tyers Ave.

Entry was gained to the Peck home by a doorkey which was kept over the entrance. At Mr. Hall's house the thief kicked in a basement window to get inside but had to make a hurried exit the same way when an occupant heard the breaking glass and summoned the neighbours.

Milk boxes adjoining the side doors at two other houses were used to advantage as the Wood and McMaster homes were entered after the doors were unlocked from the inside. The thief entered the Caldwell house through a bedroom window.

About \$50 in cash was taken from the five houses, but watches, jewellery and cameras were left untouched. The thefts were the work of one man as indicated by the single set of large footprints outside each house.

The police are still working on the breaks.

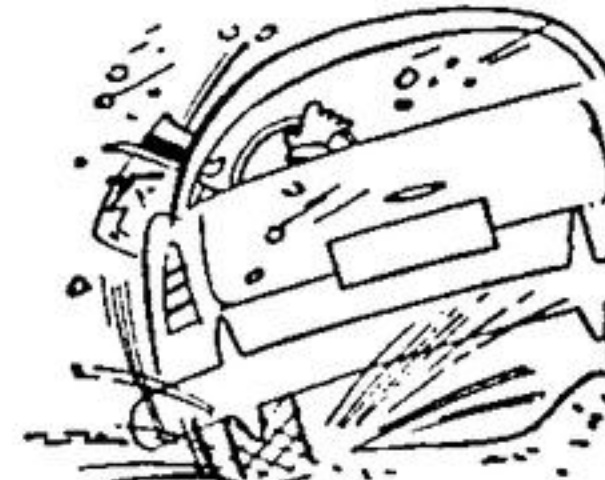
