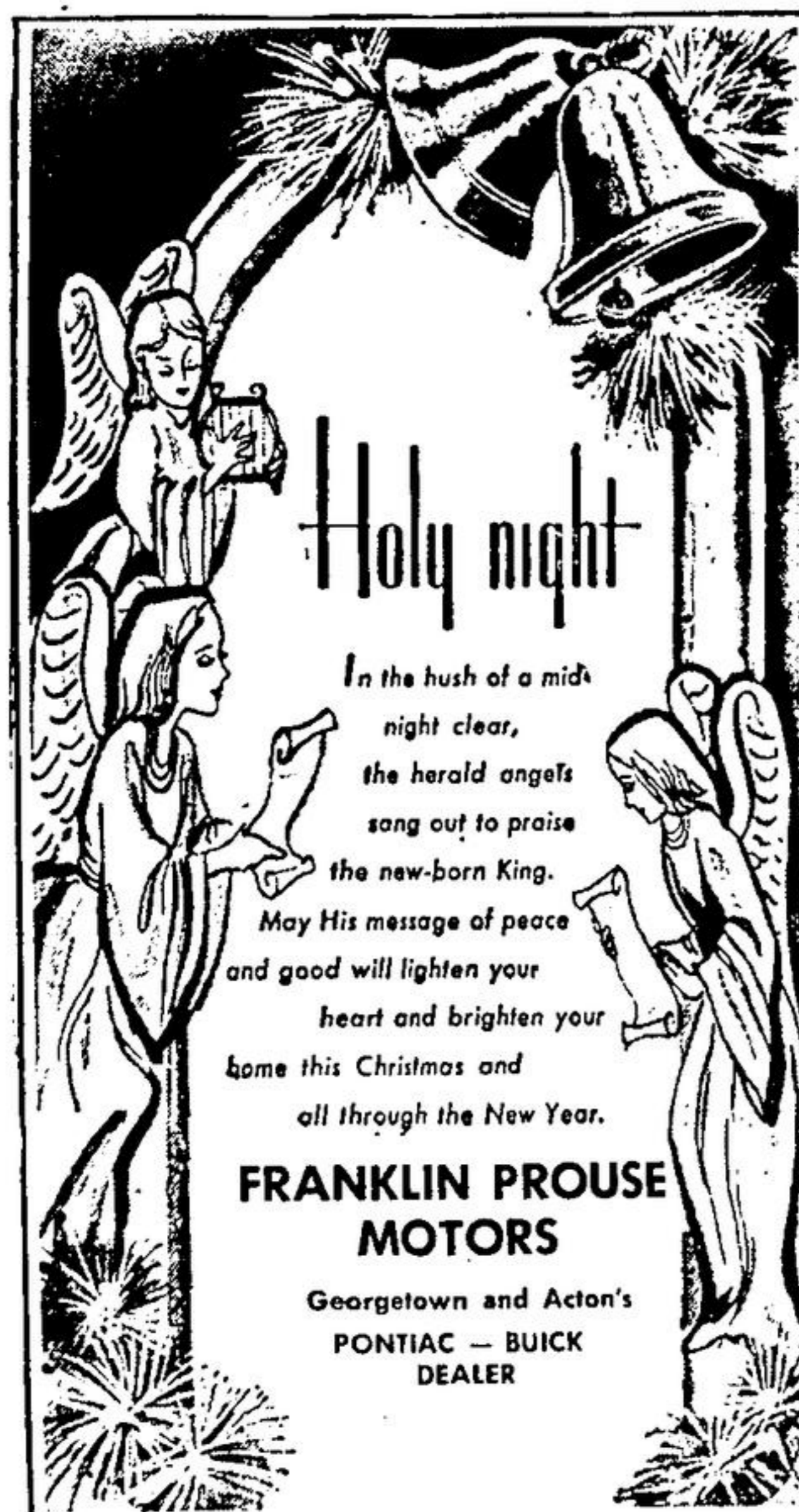

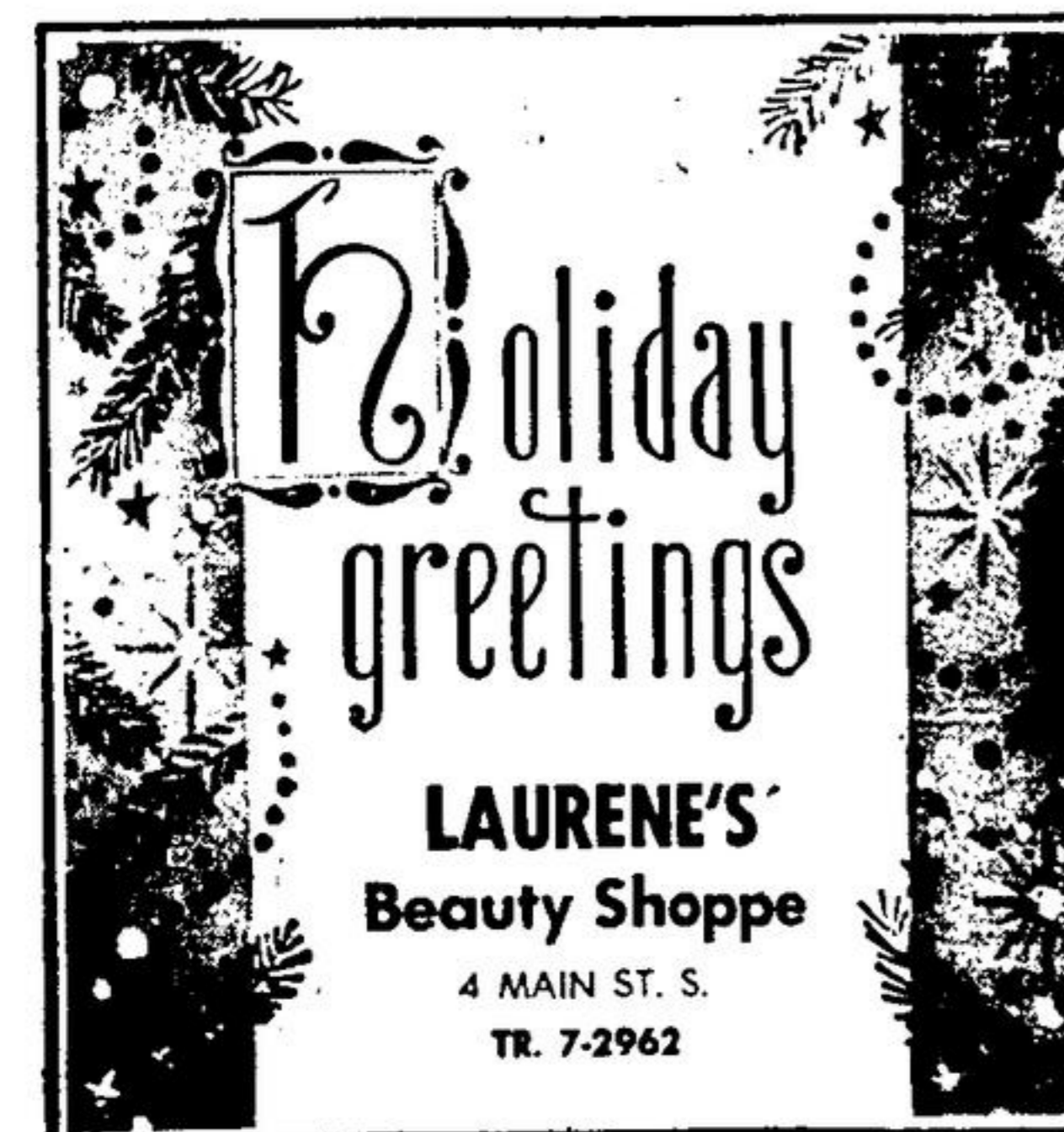

CHRISTMAS BONUS CHECKS GO TO 5,200 GRAND UNION EMPLOYEES

More than 5,200 employees of the Grand Union Company are receiving their 1956 Christmas bonus checks this week, Lansing P. Shield, president of the food chain, has announced.
A Christmas bonus of one week's pay has been given more than 4,200 full time employees who have been with the company since January 3, 1956. In addition, approximately 1,000 supervisory employees are receiving checks as participants in Grand Union's profit-sharing program, which pays a portion of its annual incentive rewards as the Christmas season.
Part-time employees of Grand Union who have been working regularly since the first of the year will receive a holiday turkey.
In a letter to employees announcing the Christmas bonus, Mr. Shield thanked each one for his "efforts to increase sales and make Grand Union a stronger company during the year."
This is the tenth year that Grand Union has awarded employees a Christmas bonus. Receiving it are persons employed in Grand Union stores, distribution centres and offices in Canada, nine eastern States of the U.S. and District of Columbia.
