## Plowing Champs End Their Tour

Russell Beilhartz of Bruce Station, Ontario, a past president of the Ontario Plowmen's Association and manager of the Canadian plowing team at the recent fourth annual World Plowing Match at Shillingford, near Oxford, England, has sent home on the spot reports of his trip with team members Robert Timbers of Stouffville, Ontario, and Edwin Demman of Portage la Prairie, Man. Here is the concluding report.

By Russell Beilhartz Oxford, England — The final day of the fourth annual World Plowing Match held at nearby Shillingford was highlighted by the acclamation of this year's world champion plowman and a ceremony in which the Duke of Gloucester, uncle of Queen Elizabeth, paid tribute to the Plowmen's Olympics.

As I mentioned in my last letter, the first day of the two-day match was given over to stubble plowing and the two plowmen who, in my opinion, stood out, were Hugh Barr of northern Ireland, world champion for the last two years, and Robert Timbers of Stouffville, Ont., the Canadian champion plowman. Edwin Demman of Portage la Prairie, Manitoba, the other member of the Canadian team, didn't fare so well because of soil sticking to his mould board, although he finished among the top ten of the 25 contestants from the 13 competing nations. The second day was grass-land plowing.

As far as the weather was concerned, it was much like the previous day with low-lying fog that cleared as the day progressed. But there was an ever larger crowd on hand, in fact much larger than was expected. There were 10,000 paid admissions.

The day started with the customary parade of judges, coaches and contestants through the demonstration grounds and out to the fields. This was begun an hour earlier than the previous day and the contestants were all in place by 11 o'clock waiting for the firing of the red rocket that would open the contest. The plots were all in a row and numbered from one to 25. Mickey Demman had number 25 and had to open his own cast-off.

This was two year sod of ley, as they call it here but it was in better condition for plowing than the stubble land. The top growth was fairly heavy. Bob had drawn a good plot and his opening furrow was excellent. Mickey also had a wonderful start and was showing great skill until he ran into trouble at the finish with the last furrow and sole furrow. On the other hand, Bob carried his good start right through to an excellent finish. But I must confess here I became quite worried and feared that he wouldn't have enough time to finish. I spoke to the stewards, asking if time could be allowed for the extra strike, and they decided to give him an additional ten minutes. I didn't tell Bob and as it happened, he didn't need the extra time. He had turned in the last furrow as the rocket signalling the close of the match soared above the field. I heaved a sigh of relief.

At that point I felt confident that we had a winner in Bob. Judging from the remarks one heard on all sides, that confidence was widely shared. But it would be an hour or more before we knew the results, or at least until after the ceremony of the unveiling of the "peace cairn" by the Duke of Gloucester.

The peace cairns, as I mentioned in my first letter, are made of stones arranged in a semi-pyramid. Their purpose is to mark the sites of World Plowing Matches. One was erected at Cobourg to commemorate the first World Match in 1953 when plowmen from some eleven countries were guests in Canada of Imperial Oil. Another was unveiled last year at Upsala, Sweden. The name "peace cairn" is derived from the theme of these matches, "Peace through the plow."

Around the top portion of the cairn is a band, or surround, of native stones bearing the names of the competing countries and contributed by them. Surmounting all is a three-foot replica of an 18th century Norfolk plow in the Kensington Museum. It is regarded as the ancestor of the modern plow in use in many parts of the western world. It was also the model for the Esso Golden Plow trophy, symbol of world plowing supremacy, which is awarded to the winner of the world match.

The unveiling ceremony was a memorable event. It created quite a bit of excitement as people here seem to love pageantry and they definitely respect loyalty. I'll do my best to describe what took place but feel I won't do justice to this great event. The cairn was located near the (continued on next page)
