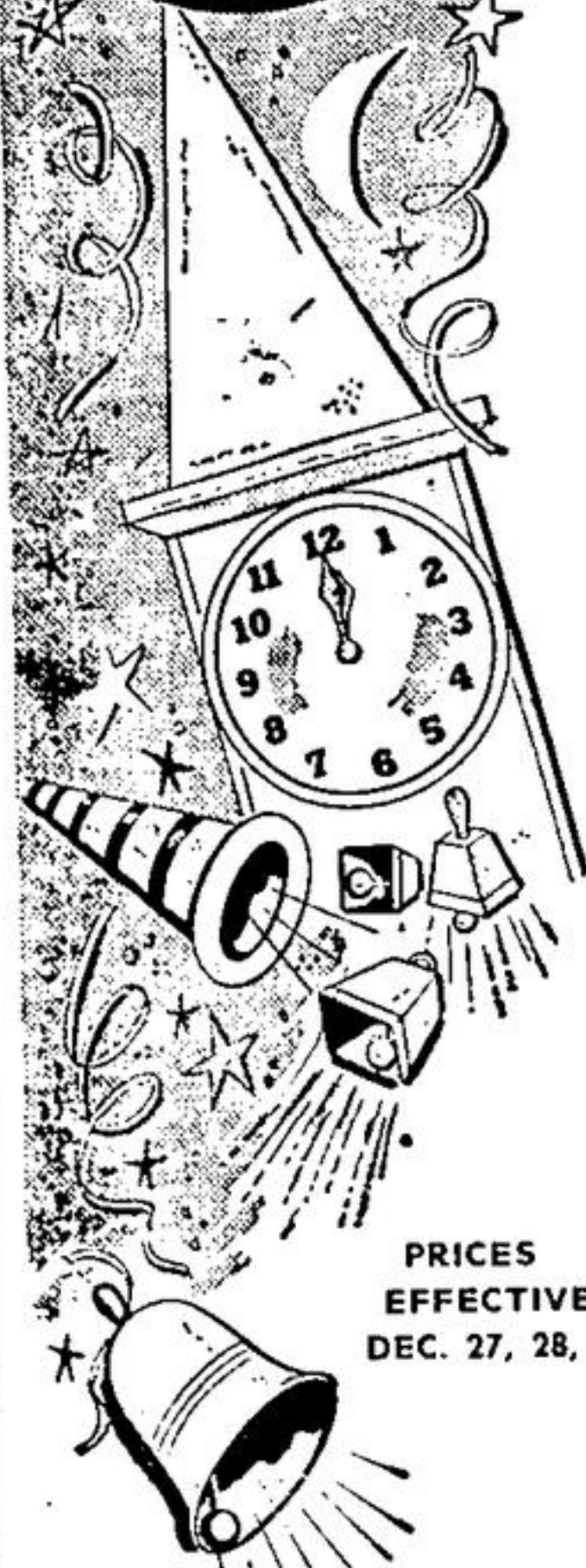

CARS COLLIDE AT McCULLOUGH'S CORNER

Luigi Ottini of 74 Ferguson St., Guelph, was rushed to Guelph General Hospital, Wednesday night following a two car collision at the corner of Highway No. 7 and the 7th line.
Mr. Ottini was travelling south in a car driven by Bruno Comacchio of the same address, when he failed to negotiate the turn. The car struck a vehicle, driven by William Rogers, 68 Church Street, Acton, which was proceeding north on the 7th line and had just halted at the highway to let the traffic clear.
Harold Harris, of Main Street, Acton, a passenger in the Rogers car was treated for facial bruises by Dr. C. V. Williams. Mr. Ottini suffered deep lacerations to the face.
Total damage to the two cars amounted to about \$800.

scene of today's plowing, and incidentally this land is owned and operated by one of the oldest colleges in Oxford. 13 flag poles, each bearing the flag of a competing country, formed a square in front of the cairn.

Before the arrival of the royal party, the 13 plowing teams took up positions in front of the flag poles. A guard of honour in full dress uniform was drawn up and there were also royal trumpeters in their colourful trappings, an official in robes of office who acted as master of ceremonies, and an archbishop accompanied by his chaplain. Standing by the corners of the cairn were girls in period costumes of the British Isles.

Into this square drive the Duke and Duchess of Gloucester, accompanied by a party including J. D. Thomas of Toronto, president of the World Plowing Match. After alighting from the car, J. D.

Thomas presented the members of the teams to their Royal Highnesses. Following the presentation, the Duke proceeded to a dais where he delivered a short address. At this point, the costumed girls pulled the cords that unveiled the peace cairn. Then the archbishop offered up a prayer and at its conclusion of the band accompanied by the royal trumpeters, played God Save the Queen. During the playing of the national anthem, plowmen from each of the teams slowly lowered their countries' flags. When the flags came to rest, the ceremony was over, and so was the fourth annual plowing match.

As soon as the royal party drove off, there was a rush to the headquarters to find out the results, but the officials were still tallying the scores. When finally it was announced that Hugh Barr of Northern Ireland was again the world champion, there was a cheer. There were also some disappointed people... including myself.

Of course, by now you all know the results, but just to refresh your memory, here is how our boys made out. Robert Timbers, fourth place with a total of 152.40, Edwin Demman, tenth with 147.50. Hugh Barr, the winner, receive 165.75 points.

Back at the hotel, we cleaned up for the post-match banquet. It was a lovely dinner and the speeches were short and interesting. But when they came to the awarding of the *Esso Golden Plow trophy*, I felt tired and a little sick and left to go to my hotel. But I suppose that is how nearly every team manager feels who lives through every step his ploughboys take and who has pinned high hopes on the outcome. Before dropping off to sleep, I told myself, "there's another year and another match." Maybe 1957 is Canada's year.

DIOCESAN CONFIRMATION HELD IN HAMILTON

The annual adult Diocesan Confirmation was held in Christ's Church Cathedral, Hamilton, on Tuesday, December 11th. The Right Reverend W. E. Bagnall, D.D., assisted by the Bishop Emeritus of Keewatin, Bishop J. Loft-house, D.D., administered the Apostolic Rite of laying on of hands. Halton Deanery presented nearly fifty per cent of the candidates. Ten candidates of Operation Firm Faith were presented from St. George's Anglican, Georgetown.

The Dean of the Cathedral, the Very Reverend W. E. Jackson, D.D., presented the candidates to the Bishops on behalf of the Diocesan clergy. The Reverend David Powell of Milton and the Reverend K. S. Richardson of Georgetown, read the scriptural exhortations. The Reverend H. F. Thom-

ason, diocesan organist, was at the console of the majestic cathedral organ.
The Bishop of the Diocese addressed the newly confirmed and stressed their part in the life and witness of the church as they enter the fullest membership with the Christ of the Altar, in the simple form of a family meal, the Holy Communion.

Immediately after the service, relatives, friends and candidates met in the parish hall for tea and refreshments. The certificates were presented to the rectors of the various parishes to be completed and given to the newly confirmed when they receive their first communion.

On Sunday, December 16, the adult group of St. George's attended at eight o'clock in the morning and corporately began their new relationship in the church. A fellowship breakfast followed and

the newly confirmed were welcomed by the rector; Sam Penrice, people's churchwarden presented the members with their signed certificates; and Charles Harris, rector's churchwarden, presented each member with a devotional book from the congregation of St. George's. Two servers convened the fellowship breakfast, Grant Casley and Rudy Meier. The rector noted the international aspect of the assembly with members from four countries participating in the great action of the church. The newly confirmed are: Miss R. Adams, Mrs. J.
