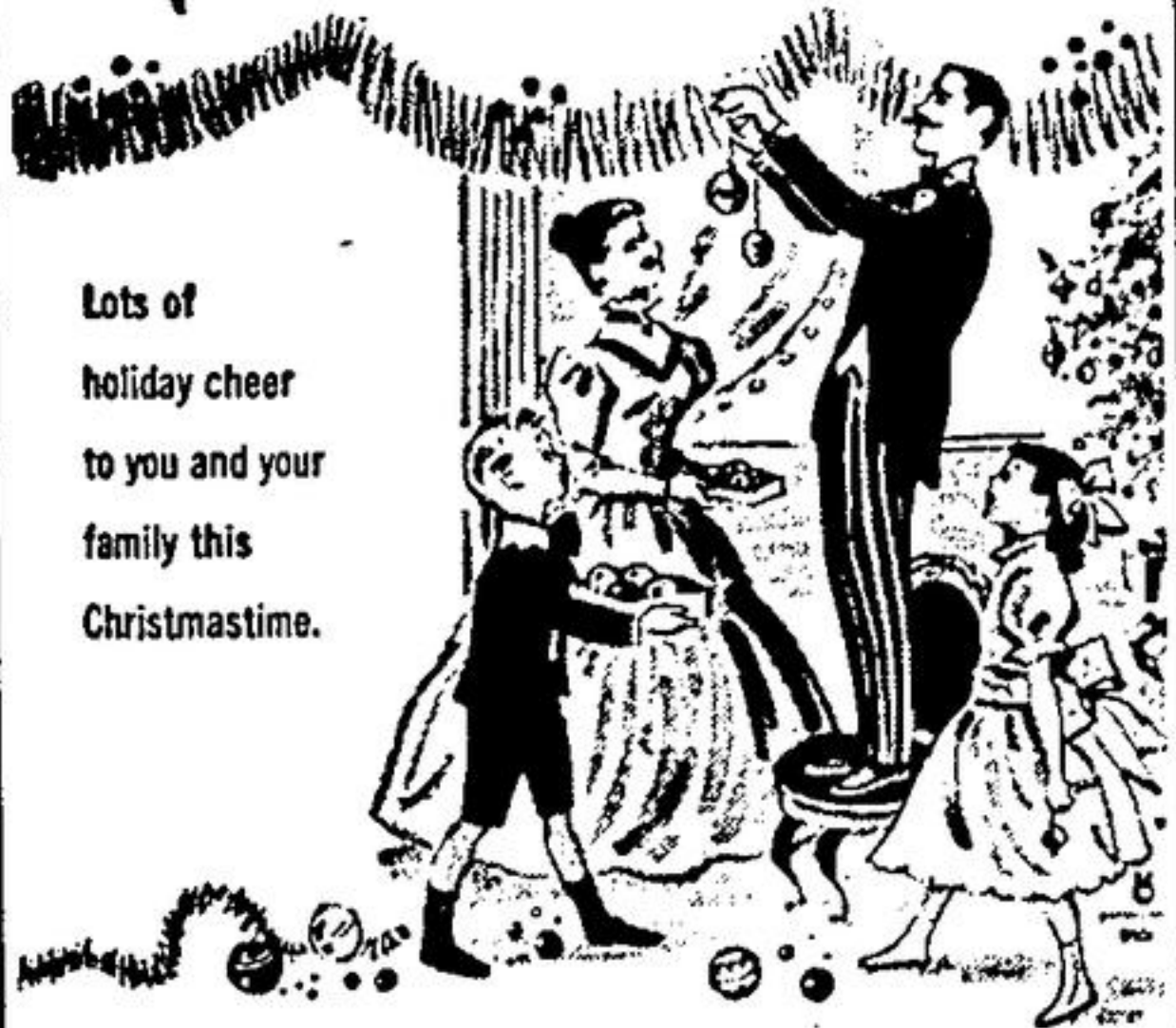

### Creditation Honour For Peel Memorial

Peel Memorial Hospital has again received a creditation from the Joint Commission on Creditation of Hospitals. The high honour, which denotes outstanding achievement, was given following the visit of Dr. J. Paul Leplante last month. Making the announcement at the board meeting, Tuesday, December 18th, president C. V. Charters paid tribute to the outstanding service of the doctors and medical staff of Peel Memorial Hospital.

Also at Tuesday night's meeting, the board reluctantly passed a room rate increase. Although nursing rates have increased 52, the average rates have only gone up \$1. Administrator Howard Krafft emphasized that Peel Memorial's new schedule is still well below those of nearby hospitals at Oakville, Etobicoke, and Weston in almost all categories.

"Increase cost, all along the line, have forced us into revising our rates," he explained. "Some drugs, medical and surgical supplies have jumped as much as ten per cent in the past year, and food and maintenance costs are continuing a steady climb."
