

ORILLIA VICTORY GIVES RAIDERS FIRST PLACE

Georgetown Raiders took over first place in their Senior 'B' group, December 28th with a 6-4 victory over Orillia Pontiacs.
Although the Raiders got themselves five penalties of the first period they took a 3-0 lead. All five goals were scored by different players. Junior Beaumont opened the scoring at 2:04. Before the smoke had cleared George Grassy, Jerry Inglis, Blake Inglis and Dave Irons had added four more goals against a stunned Orillia crew.
In the second period, Bud Haines made it 4-0 before the Pontiacs could find the range. The period was almost over before Orillia could penetrate the Georgetown defence and the great goal tending

of Fred Lawrence. When Pete Bradkin got a penalty for the Raiders, Earl McCrone scored on a screened shot. Wynn Mousseau got their second two minutes later. The period ending with Georgetown in front 6-2.
Although the Orillia team tried their hearts out in the third period they were only able to score two goals. Woods got one at 5:11 and Earl McCrone getting his second of the evening at 13:54. With the Raiders' three men short (White, Chard and Kentner) they tried a bit in this period, but terrific goal tending by Lawrence held the Pontiacs off.
