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JUNIORS END SCHEDULE WITH 8-6 ACTON WIN

The Junior Raiders closed off the schedule on a triumphant note on Friday, outlasting Acton 8-6 in a see-saw contest in Tannery town that showed the Harrison, Charlton, Beckett line to advantage. The recently formed unit was credited with 6 tallies the same amount as the entire Acton team collected in the sixty quick moving minutes.

The Actonites were the real opportunists in the first period, catching the J.R.s flat footed on both of their goals to skate off at the end of the session on even terms. Georgetown carried the play for most of the period as Acton couldn't find a combination that could skate with the Junior Raiders.

Neither team overwhelmed the opposition with their power while playing with the man advantage. Acton were guilty of some weird passing. Georgetown shooting was nowhere near the target, the alarm signalling the end of the periods gave three feeble coughs and died and the time clock fell apart to start the hectic 2nd period. The only goal chalked up for the Acton crew was of the fluke variety, a long shot that Lockhurst ducked under.

Most of the action however was crammed into the final stanza. In the first half of the period the J.R.s piled one goal on top of another until they built up what looked like a safe four goal lead only to have Hall come back with a two goal outbreak that put Acton back in contention right up until the end of the game. The way they were floundering in the dying minutes the Junior Raiders probably would have had trouble with the Camp Fire Girls broomball team. Another overtime period would have been tragic.

The win was the fifth in a row and left Georgetown in the runner-up spot behind first place Preston. The J.R.s however, hung onto their reputation as the highest scoring team in the league with 114 goals in the sixteen game schedule.

Charlton put Georgetown one up midway through the first period, when he deked the Acton defense to the left side and then skated right in to rap it behind Nelson. Black's tying goal which came just a couple of minutes later hit a skate before trickling into the lower left hand corner. Footitt got the assist.

Georgetown didn't look good on Acton's second goal. Hall, after taking Arbie's pass at centre ice, threaded his way through the entire Georgetown team and just poked it behind Lockhurst with exactly one minute remaining. Nelson did not even see the equalizer banged in by Cunningham, 36 seconds later after Ken Richardson centered out from behind the net.

Harrison notched his thirteenth of the season after just 60 seconds of play had elapsed in the second period to put the Junior Raiders back out in front 3-2. Charlton set up the goal by relaying Beckett's pass to Harrison uncovered in front of the net. Blacks tally at 3:35 should have given Lockhurst an assist. The J.R.s goalie, who finished second in the race for netminders' honours, misjudged the long high shot from just outside the blue line, ducking to let the shot sail over the cage. It caught the top of the mesh.

In the 13th minute, at 12:16, Beckett stick handled out front of the net and dumped one between Nel-

son's pads to make it 4-3 Georgetown and cap the second period scoring. Harrison got the assist.

Doug Richardson fattened the lead with a dash in from the blue line at the 1:09 mark on a pass from Tucker. Charlton and Harrison, numbers 1 and 2 in the point totals, combined talents to extend the lead to 5, Harrison on the scoring end at 8:13 and just 9 seconds later Theo Charlton turned the trick on a pass from Harrison. Hart came close when he hit the post one minute later on a hard back hand from an almost impossible angle.

With Cunningham sitting out, a tripping penalty, Acton organized an attack that didn't really end until the final whistle. At 14:27 Hall beat Lockhurst from a scramble with Arbie inside the goal crease. Despite protests from the J.R.s the referee allowed the goal on the basis that the Acton player was pushed in. Georgetown got it back on quick break by Harrison. The fast skating forward carried right by the open corner and then layed a perfect backhand pass out to Beckett trailing on the play. The puck was in the twine almost as it touched his stick.

Acton continued right where they left off, crowding the Georgetown net. In the final minutes of play which must have seemed like hours to Lockhurst, Acton kept throwing rubber at the vulnerable cage until at 19:00 minutes even, a rising shot off the stick of Hall found an open corner. Footitt poked up the assist on the goal, Hall's third of the game. Thompson drew his second penalty in succession 10 seconds later and had a box seat when Acton scored their sixth, Arbie all alone at 19:24. The J.R.s somehow managed to hang onto their 2 goal lead for the entire remaining half minute.

Georgetown will renew their feud with Preston when the two teams clash in Preston's Memorial auditorium next Saturday night, the first game in what should be a hotly contested 4 out of 7 playoff series.
