### FARM NEWS STOCKER AND FEEDER CATTLE IN ONTARIO

The number of cattle taken back to Ontario farms during the year 1956 was an all time high of 250,848 head, of which 42,258 were stoker and feeder cattle weighing mostly 400 to 550 lbs. The movement was even greater than during the drought year of 1957, when the movement of cattle from Western Canada to eastern pastures was subsidized. Of the total number of replacements during 1956, some 87 per cent were cattle from Western Canada. Half the number were purchased on the Ontario Stock Yards, and the balance billed there from the west. The average weight of the cattle classed as stockers and sold on the Toronto yards was close to 700 lbs. Short keep feeders were not in preference with stockyard buyers, but were more in evidence in the through killed stock.

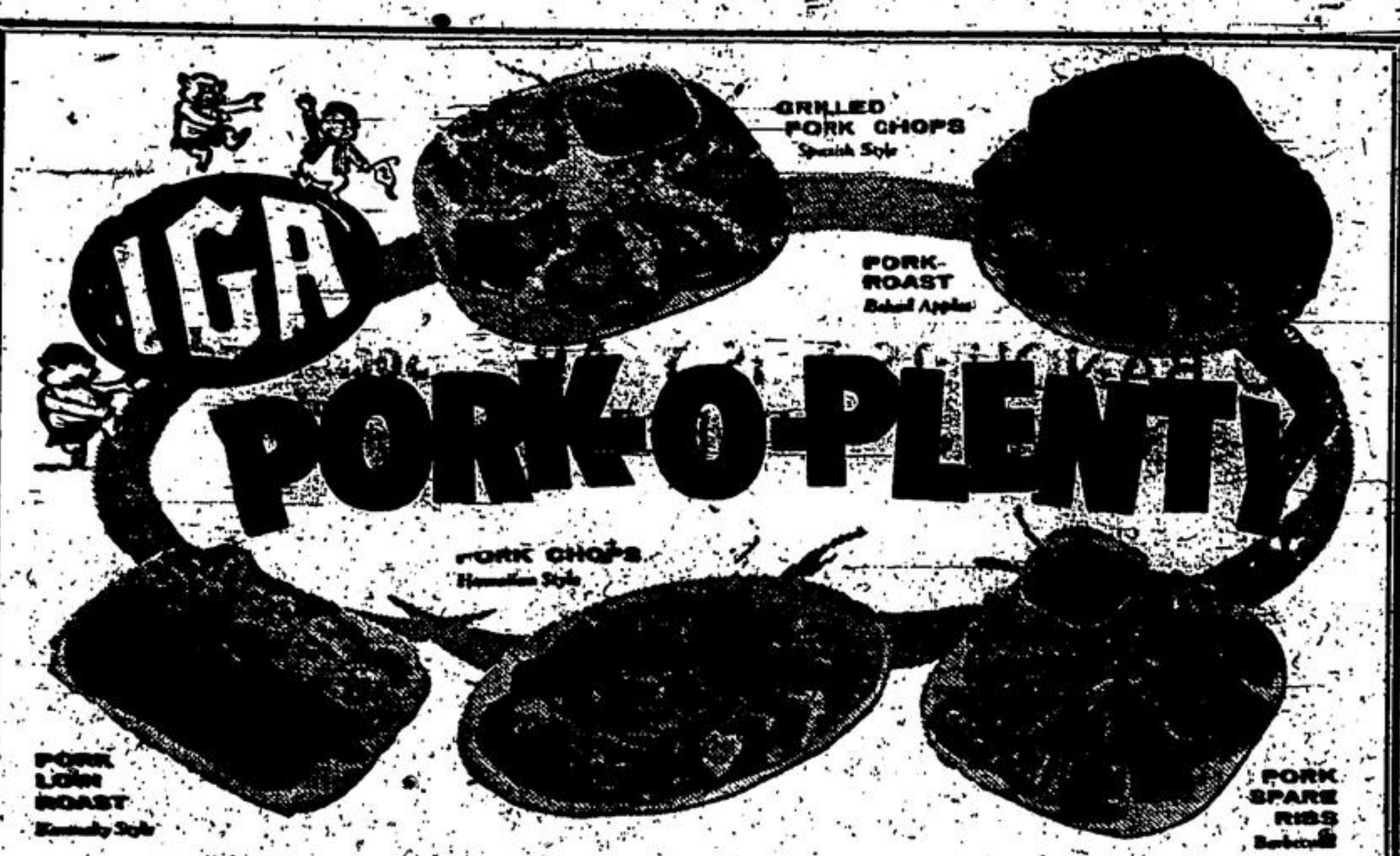
