**Terms Ambulance Buy "Pig in a Poke"** To the Editor: Georgetown was recently faced with the prospect of being without an ambulance service because operators could not make their businesses pay. To take care of this situation, council called a public meeting to discuss the state of affairs. Out of this meeting came the Georgetown Volunteer Ambulance Service — the FIRST of its kind in Canada — some 70 men leaving their services at the disposal of the Town. The alternative was to subsidize private individuals to the tune of from \$3800 to \$7500 per annum — heads we win, tails you lose. In considering equipment for the new service, council called for tenders on a new ambulance, but no tenders or alternatives were asked for second hand vehicles. We find no fault with using second-hand equipment, but we do find fault and raise violent objection to purchasing (with public funds) a 1951 sedan delivery (converted or modified as you will) for the sum of \$900. In good old-fashioned horse trading, this vehicle (yes, regardless of condition) is worth no more than \$450. But then, we did say "old-fashioned horse trading."

At Monday night's council meeting, by a recorded vote of 6-3, you Mr. John Public bought this "pig in the poke." We were saddened that 'council procedure' was used to quell participation by the public gallery. General discussion was impossible because the motion was whipped onto the table before you could say "knife." Anyone who says that kind of money on that kind of deal is either a fool or a knave, take your choice. We've made ours. In conclusion we must apologize for not reporting proceedings in chronological sequence, the meeting opened with a report on the inadequacies of our sewage system. Sincerely, —John A.
