Open \$90,000 Registry Office in County Town

Halton County's new \$90,000 registry office was officially opened last week when Hugh Donald, Inspector of legal offices, cut the customary ribbon, followed by a reception and dinner for 100 guests representing several county organizations.

Hon. Kelso Roberts, Q.C., Ontario's attorney-general, was guest speaker at the dinner in the Sunday School room of St. Paul's United Church. He reviewed the history of the registry office which was first opened 100 years ago.

Head table guests included architect T. Allan Sage, county law association president T. A. Hutchinson; county registrar Bill Matlock; Mrs. Kelso Roberts; Halton M.P.P. Stan Hall and Mrs. Hall; county warden T. Millward; Nelson Reeve Harold Adams, who was dinner chairman; former registrar Miss Myrtle Field; and Rev. J. Lorne Graham.

After dinner congratulations were offered by the warden, ex-Warden Stan Allen of Georgetown, architect Sage, contractor Dunker, registrar Matlock, Stratford registrar of deeds Jack Sorenson and Inspector Donald. County engineer Roy Smith, who was responsible for the design of the registry office, was also introduced.

A gold-plated foot-long key was presented by the architect to commemorate the opening, and it will be mounted on a plaque and hung in the new office.

CCF Nominations are Planned in Georgetown

Many important matters were discussed at the general membership meeting of the Halton CCF Riding Association held at 246 Brant Street in Burlington, Thursday, March 21st. Arrangements were completed for the nomination meeting to be held in Georgetown early in April with Professor George Grube of Toronto University and chairman of the Provincial CCF Executive, as guest speaker.

Nine delegates were elected to represent Halton riding at the forthcoming Provincial convention to be held in Toronto in April. Resolutions to the convention were discussed with three being submitted from Halton—on provincial gas pipelines, nursery schools and campaign expenditures.

Mrs. Joan McIntosh, Burlington, and Jack Henry, Oakville, reported on the CCF Educational Conference held in Hamilton in February; Don Heatherington, Oakville, gave an interesting report on the CCF Trade Union Conference held in Toronto, noting particularly the interest and enthusiasm of the trade union delegates and their determination to go back to their respective areas throughout the province and work for the election of CCF candidates as the only true representatives of labour.

Jack Henry and Don Heatherington were elected to the riding executive to represent Trafalgar and Oakville, respectively. A report on the membership drive showed that Halton had reached its quota and would go well over the top by April 15, the close of the drive for the province. A campaign committee was set up and elections plans made. Lunch was served during which a general discussion took place on the CCF Federal program just issued "Share Canada's Wealth".

Hornby Boy Stars Television Series

First in a series of telecasts which will depict the life of a typical Ontario farm boy appeared Sunday afternoon on the Junior Magazine program over CBLT-TV.

The program had particular local interest as it stars 13-year-old Keith Ella, son of Mr. and Mrs. Ken Ella, Hornby, whose father and mother are directors of Esqueping Agricultural Society.

Keith was filmed a month ago in different aspects of life on the Base Line farm. The films will be compared with others about a typical city boy.

Many of the animals on the Ella farm are included in the pictures, and his classmates at Hornby public school got into the act too while the company was shooting films at the school.

P. W. Cook, Federal Election Officer

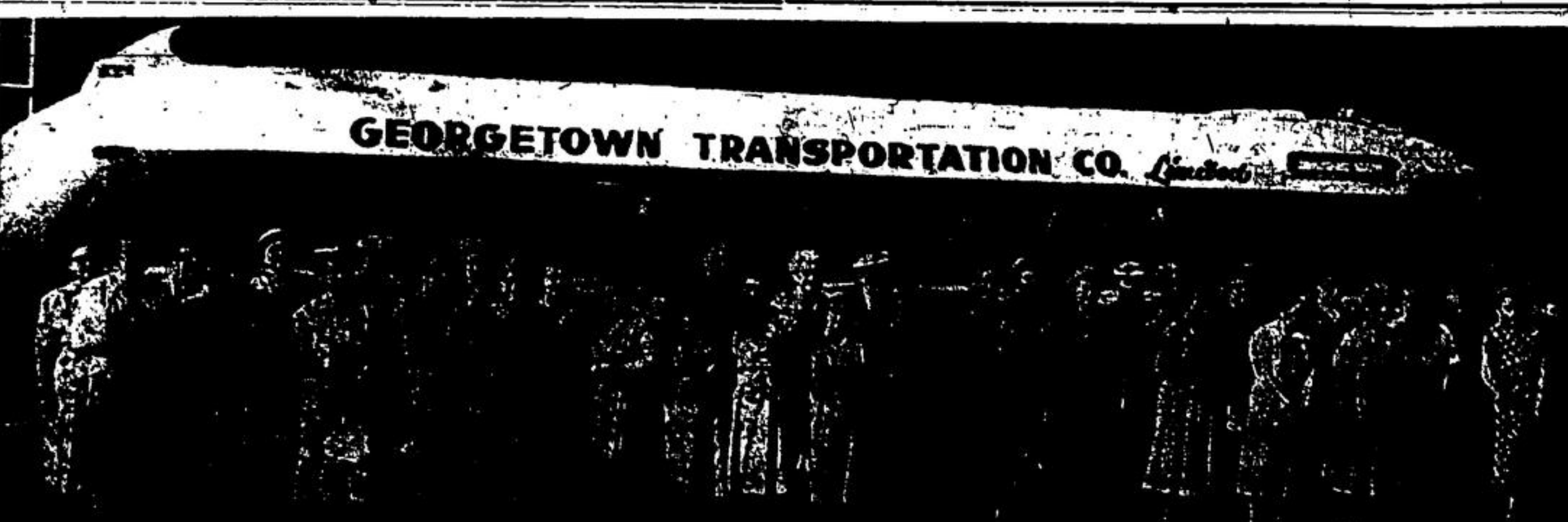
