## Rev. W.T. Turner Once Norval-Union Minister

Minister of Norval and Union Presbyterian Churches from 1904 to 1911, Rev. W. D. Turner died in Montreal on March 18th.

Mr. Turner had served at Blyth, Winchester and Hillsburgh since leaving Norval, retiring from the active ministry when he was in Hillsburgh.

He leaves his wife, Margaret Scott, and four children: Mrs. (Dr.) F. M. Jones (Edith) of Montreal, Dr. Alice W. Turner, Toronto, Grace (Mrs. H. G. Bowes) of Coburg and Marion (Mrs. David Beattie) of Montreal.

The funeral service was conducted on Thursday at the Coburg funeral home of his son-in-law, H. C. Bowes, who formerly had a funeral home in Hillsburgh. Interment was in Union Cemetery, Cobourg.

## Three Grass Fires and Week-end False Alarm

Four week-end fire calls, three Saturday and one Sunday, took the brigade to Limehouse, the western limits of the CNR yard at the outskirts of town the Ray Harley residence, 10 Durham Street and a section of the Heslop property on the 8th Line.

Chief Jack Harlow and some of the firemen were right on top of the 8th Line blaze before any damage could be done. The firemen were on their way back to the house after burning off the grass at the 8th line property of Perc Saxe when they saw two men start grass burning operations behind a barn on the adjoining field.

The firemen watched for a while and then turned in an alarm for more help when the flames raged out of control and threatened the nearby bush owned by Mr. Saxe. They had little trouble in killing the outbreak.

The grass fire on the CNR tracks was almost expected since sparks from passing trains ignite the dry grass every year about this time. The firemen beat this one out in a very short time.

The yard still puzzled as to who turned in the alarm which sent them to 10 Durham Street where there was no sign of a fire.

The Sunday fire was another grass fire, this time at Limehouse. No damage resulted.
