Soccer Team Planning For an Active Season

Georgetown Soccer Club is entering this season full of confidence and eager to get going.

Last year the Georgetown had carried all before them, topping the league to win the Labatt trophy without losing a single league game, also going to the final in the Bronte Invitation Cup. The finalists, Bronte and Georgetown will play sometime this season to decide who keeps the cup.

This season sees many changes, inasmuch as all four sections of the Southern O.S.L. have been amalgamated into a 2nd division: Georgetown has been honoured with a berth in the Premier division, with such soccer stalwarts as Sette, Bello, Kitchener, Rapids of Hamilton and teams from the Niagara peninsula. This should give local fans the kind of soccer they rightly deserve — the best.
