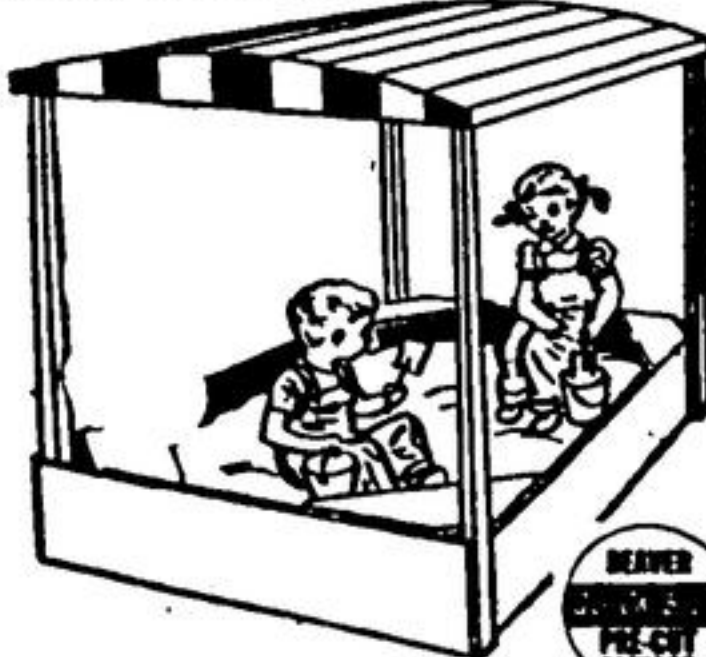

Caledon Votes Today On Beer, Wine Sale

In what promises to be the conclusion of a spirited campaign, in which both supporting parties are confident of success, voters in Caledon township will go to the polls today to decide whether Caledon will retain her dry status after a long period of time or change over to regulated sale of beer and wine with a small number of outlets for the sale.

Ordinarily the "drys" would have good reason for their confidence but Caledon, says the Peel Gazette, like other municipalities in the county, has many new residents located there and this may provide for a keen, close fight. The chief villages affected by the decision are Caledon, Alton and Inglewood, for it the "wets" get the green light, these particular centres would likely get outlets for the sale of beer and wine.

It is believed the rural vote will give a majority to the "drys" and that the "wets" are counting on Alton and Caledon villages for their best support. However, it promises to be a keen fight.

The Caledon Citizens' Committee have been working assiduously in their campaign to keep Caledon dry and have a very effective slogan, "Keep Caledon Clean for Our Kids." Officers of the committee are confident that their efforts will be crowned with success. A three-fifths vote is necessary for the "wets" to achieve their objective and this in itself is a terrific handicap to overcome.

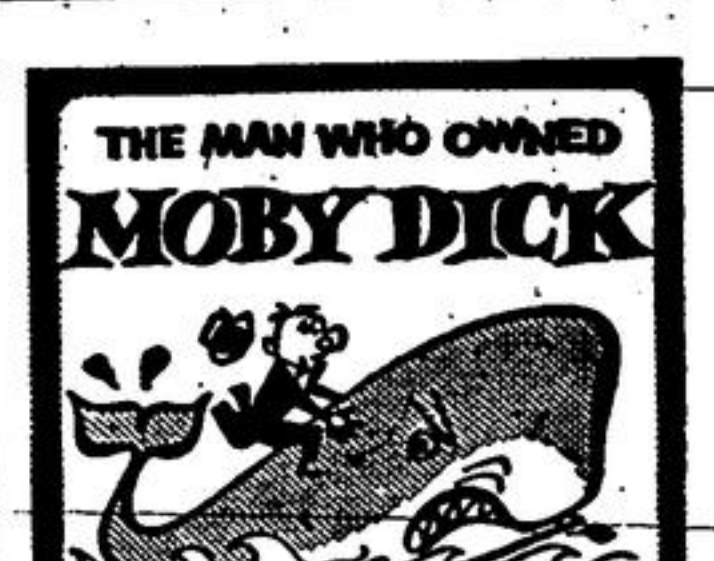

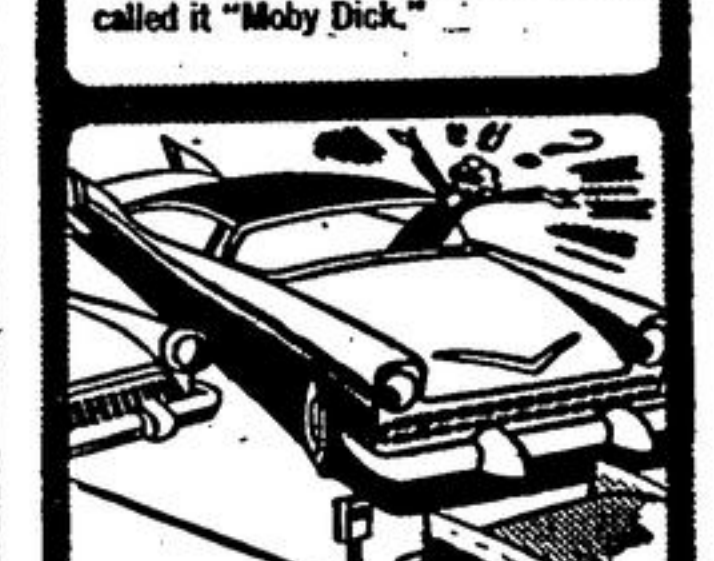

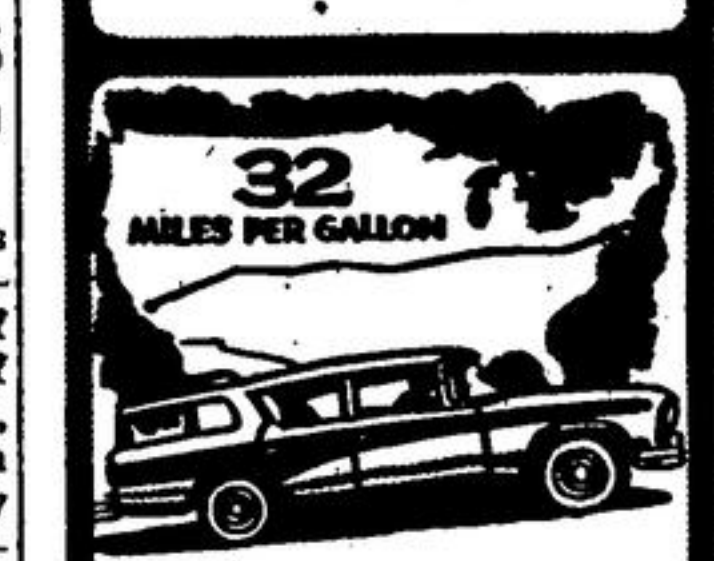
