1600 GET FREE X-RAYS DURING CLINIC VISIT

Some 1600 local and district people took advantage of the free X-ray clinic conducted by Halton TB and Health association. The traveling clinic visited Norval and spent three days in Georgetown, where it was set up in Knox Presbyterian Church auditorium.

Rev. Alex Calder acted as chairman and Mrs. William B. Hamilton secretary for the organization work which included door-to-door canvassing to acquaint people with the nature of the clinic, and a large number of volunteer assistants who recorded information during clinic hours.

Whole Milk President To Speak in Halton

Gordon Callon, of Westworth County, who has been active in Milk Producer circles for a long period of years, is to be the guest speaker at Stewarttown on Thursday, May 23rd, at 8:30 p.m., states John M. Bird, secretary of District No. 12, Toronto Milk Producers' Association.

Mr. Callon who is president of the Ontario Whole Milk Producers' League should have a message of real interest to all whole milk shippers. John W. Pawley, newly appointed secretary-manager of the Toronto Milk Producers' Association will also bring a message to milk producers of the area.

Bulk Hauling

Bulk hauling of milk, has been a controversial issue at Milk Producer meetings for the past year and a half or more. At one time, it seemed that the majority of Halton milk shippers would go out of the business, rather than submit to this new development which necessitated a capital expenditure of anywhere from \$1,500 to \$3,000 on the part of the individual milk shipper.

We have been a bit surprised therefore this past week to find how many Halton shippers have already installed this new piece of equipment. Strange as it may seem, new bulk tank owners seem to be rather pleased with their new pieces of equipment.

True the cost of installation hurts but this new development does eliminate the laborious job of swinging 80 lb. cans in and out of the old milk coolers or vats.

In view of the fact that most Halton and Peel shippers still have the problem ahead, those in charge of the programme for the joint Halton and Peel Field Day at Guelph on Saturday, June 8th, have arranged for a panel discussion on the subject of "bulk hauling, coolers, etc."

This is scheduled for the basement of Memorial Hall, at 10:45 a.m. Staff members from the Departments of Dairying, Agricultural Engineering, and Economics, will make up the panel. The departments mentioned have over the past two or three years, given a good deal of study to the various aspects of the subject and their findings should be of real value to those who still have the problem to meet.
