WHAT COUNCIL DID

**Transfer Magistrate?
Not Interested: Council**

Georgetown council intimating a "hands off" policy towards a suggestion of North Halton Urban board that Magistrate K. M. Langdon be transferred to another county, when the matter was briefly discussed at Thursday's council meeting.

"The matter was mentioned in minutes of the urban board meeting read as part of the council correspondence.

"Some board members feel that the magistrate is not backing up police officers in court," said Deputy Reeve Doug Sargent, who is chairman this year of the urban board. "Examples of judgments bordering on the ridiculous were quoted at the urban meeting."

"I don't want to set myself up as a judge of a magistrate," said C. McGillivray. "A short time ago there were complaints that he was handling out too strict convictions."

"It's not our business at all," was Cr. Ern Hyde's opinion.

"If the magistrate is not supporting the police then it's our problem," said Reeve Stan Allen.

The Auxiliary to 1st Georgetown Scout Troop was given permission to hold a bushel of pennies drive on June 7-8.

Appearing for a client who would build a new house on an Edith St. property which now contains a partly-buried building last occupied by Whitmee Electric, solicitor Tom Van Sicker was told that the council would approve the house providing there is a separate deed for the property which was originally part of another parcel of land.

The lot has the required 50 ft. frontage, but is short of the 5,000 square foot minimum required by the building by-law.

"I'm asked to pay business tax on a \$350 assessment for my shop on Mill St., but I don't do any business there," complained taxi operator W. O. Brownridge. Mr. Brownridge said he had received no assessment notice prior to being billed for taxes.

He was told that as the office is maintained as a place of business and has a business phone listing, it is proper to assess business tax on it.

Complaint of Lorne Garvin that damage had been inflicted to his car when it was pushed by the town truck while parked in front of a Main Street restaurant, was turned over to the insurance company and the town engineer was asked to report to council on the incident.

An offer by fuel oil dealer Bill Bailey to provide waste containers in various parts of town was turned over to the property committee for consideration.

A \$400 sodding job for the north bank of the new Maple Ave. extension was ordered, which will stop erosion onto the roadway.

Questioning a \$250 expenditure for calcium on Maple Avenue, Cr. Harrison was told by road chairman Walter Gray that weather conditions did not permit use of oil at the time dust laying was needed.

Cr. Harrison said Brampton had used oil a month ago.

"I saw it and my car was picking it up as the dust was flying," said Mayor Armstrong, claiming Brampton's early oiling a sad experience. Cr. Hyde agreed that oiling before the weather is warm is a waste of time and money.

Cr. Gray said that when calcium was laid it initially had not been too effective, but with wet weather it is now doing a good job.
