

WHAT COUNCIL DID

Transfer Magistrate? Not Interested: Council

Georgetown council intimating a "hands off" policy towards a suggestion of North Halton Urban board that Magistrate K. M. Langdon be transferred to another county, when the matter was briefly discussed at Thursday's council meeting.

Questioning a \$250 expenditure for calcium on Maple Avenue, Cr. Harrison was told by road chairman Walter Gray that weather conditions did not permit use of oil at the time dust laying was needed. Cr. Harrison said Brampon had

used oil a month ago. "I saw it and my car was picking it up as the dust was flying" said Mayor Armstrong, claiming Brampton's early oiling a sad experience. Cr. Hyde agreed that oiling before the weather is warm is a waste of time and money.

Cr. Gray said that when calcium was laid it initially had not been too effective, but with wet weather it is now doing a good job.
