Rex Heslop Explains
Last Thursday's council meeting was largely devoted to the housing subject too, with Rex Heslop speaking at some length about his firm's proposal and answering numerous questions posed by councillors.

He stressed that what the firm proposed would not create any additional town costs at the present time, or any debenture debt for at least two years.

"In creating activity, Georgetown will be on the move," he said. "Industry is run by human beings and they want to get on the bandwagon. They look at a live town, one where they can obtain their labour force."

He said Delrex has come up with a good house at a low price which test advertising is proving attractive to a large number of people living in the Burlington to Bayview area. The publicity about low price housing is bringing people to look, he said, and is indirectly helping all house sales for some of them are buying in the higher priced areas.

Questions and Answers
A number of questions by councillors were answered by Mr. Heslop.

Q. What are your plans for a shopping centre?
A. We have a couple of deals going at the moment which could result in a much more massive centre than originally planned.

Q. How many units do you plan?
A. Five hundred, which will be built on 400 lots.

Q. Aren't local contractors standing still at present?
A. What ones? We have serviced lots available for all builders and several are taking advantage of them. If some builders are standing still it's because they haven't seen fit to move or are sitting waiting for people to come to them.

Q. If council approved the plan, could it be carried out in stages, possibly building 50 at a time so we could feel our way?
A. I couldn't consider it. Delrex would be putting a quarter of a million dollars into this, and we must keep our staff working to capacity.

Q. You promised when the first section was released for home building that industry would follow. Now you say if this second section is released industry will come.

A. There's been 2 1/2 million dollars assessment increase in the old part of town since we started, and we didn't see that — nor the cut-back in credit. I'm not looking for alibis, but am trying to do the best with the situation as it exists at present.

Q. Would you have approval for temporary septic tanks before starting construction?
A. I don't anticipate any trouble.

Q. If we had 100 houses built and the Water Resources Commission said septic tanks must be abandoned, what would we do?
A. The only approval they can give is a complete disposal plant. If the municipality goes to them, the project would stop right now.

Q. Our question is 'Is there going to be any disposal system the commission will condemn?'
A. Your present plant is condemned, but I prevailed on the department to hold off, that Delrex would help make it right.

Q. Delrex is costing Georgetown extra money for police, schools, etc. If this proceeds there will be tax revenue but there will be extra costs too.
A. There's been too much talk this past year of Delrex as being separate. We're part of Georgetown, pay full taxes, but put in our own roads and services.

Q. The only extra cost to the town for Delrex water. There would be an 89 mill tax rate right now without Delrex. The new water system was ordered before Delrex came into being.
Mr. Heslop stressed that no one is more interested than his firm in keeping tax rates down, for this is very important for industrial selling. Building of the houses will create a demand for both industry and commercial growth, he said.
