### WHAT COUNCIL DID

#### Says Health Dept. Pushing Town For A New Disposal Plant

Indications that the provincial health department may force Georgetown to construct a new sewage disposal plant were given in a report to council Monday by town engineer Doug G. Wilson. Mr. Wilson told council of an interview that day, in which the matter had been discussed by himself and Rex Hleslop with Dr. Berry, head of the health department. He reported that Dr. Berry would not accept a temporary sewage disposal plant for any large scale housing project such as proposed by Delrex Developments, and that Dr. Berry believes Georgetown should make some start towards a new disposal plant. It would not be essential to build the complete plant at the start, he said, nor would it be necessary to start financing immediately. The newly-formed Water Resources Commission can offer to a town what amounts to "term payments" to municipalities faced with major sewage disposal problems, it was intimated.

Dr. Berry expressed concern over future swage plans for Georgetown, Mr. Wilson said, and intends to meet with council at an early date to hear what is planned. It was suggested that a meeting be held tomorrow, but arrangements would not be made for this and arrangements are being made to have him attend a council meeting at a later date. Cr. Ern Hyde objected to a meeting with Dr. Berry until council has given further study to a plan drawn up by a firm of consultants. Cr. Hyde also proposed that a report which C. R. Hagey, original consultant when the sewer system was installed, would provide for \$600 be ordered. "I can't see a plant we put in ten years ago at a cost of \$135,000 being obsolete today" was Cr. Hyde's opinion. Mr. Hagey has intimated he can make the present plant work satisfactorily, he continued, and council should be willing to spend \$600 to hear his proposals.

#### GEORGE GUTHRIE, 88 WAS CITY POLICE CHIEF

George Guthrie, 88, a Georgetown "old boy" who was chief of police in Toronto at the time of his retirement, died in Toronto today. Mr. Guthrie's brother Nat, who died last year was also a lifelong member of the city police force.

### WHAT COUNCIL DID

#### Expect Bond Firm Will Assist Town Debentures

"I think Bankers' Bond will come up soon with a marketing idea. No other firm seems interested and if we don't give them a chance to sell them, we may wait a long time for our money," said Finance Chairman Garfield McGilvray at Monday's council meeting. Cr. McGilvray reported on a recent visit of bond firm representative and insurance company deputies who had made a tour of the town after being entertained at dinner at North Halton Golf Club by the finance committee. The insurance firms are one which already hold town debentures, and Cr. McGilvray said they seemed impressed with the town in general and he felt their visit would be beneficial. The town still has a large block of bonds to issue to pay for a number of capital expenditures made last year.

A request from the police to assist the athletic association in installing playground equipment in the park was turned over to the property committee for a decision.

Road chairman Walter Gray detailed work in progress in his department. This includes preparing unpaved roads for surface treatment, working on the Swanek drainage problem, Guelph Street storm sewer and Sunbeam drainage.

An original maintenance program of \$28,000 has been reduced to \$20,000 he said, and it is difficult to know what to tackle on road work this year.

Due to next Monday being federal election day, and the municipal building being used as a polling station, council will meet on Wednesday evening.
