CATTLE PRODUCERS
 A Public Hearing will be held at the following time and place
JUNE 20, FERGUS - BEATTY'S HALL - 2 P.M. D.S.T.

For the purpose of considering and discussing a proposal by the Ontario Beef Producers' Association to levy a license fee at the rate of 10 cents per head on all cattle and 5 cents per head on calves for each head slaughtered for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Association in carrying out its objects of stimulating, increasing, and improving the marketing of Ontario cattle for slaughter through advertising, education and research or other means.
 The meeting will be chaired by an officer of the Ontario Farm Products Marketing Board. A representative of the Ontario Beef Producers' Association will be present to outline the plan.
 Before the Farm Products Marketing Board may approve the proposed plan by order, it must be satisfied that 60 per cent of the producers are in favor of the proposal.
 All cattle producers are urged to attend and express their views on the proposed plan.
