## Wife Saves Husband in 10th Line Near Drowning

A very courageous wife saved her husband from certain death by drowning on Sunday evening at the Tenth Line Bridge, Glen Williams. Three persons have already lost their lives in this dangerous spot previously.

Mr. and Mrs. William Lieder and their three children had enjoyed a pleasant family swim and Mrs. Lieder and the children had come out of the water and had dressed while Mr. Lieder decided to stay in a while longer. Watching him Mrs. Lieder noticed he had been caught in the undertow and was in difficulty. Fully clothed she jumped in and by the time she reached him he had lost consciousness. Fortunately Mrs. Lieder is a strong swimmer and she was able to bring her husband to the bank of the river. The fact that he is a large man made her task more difficult. Artificial respiration was applied for fifteen minutes before the swimmer was revived by Cyril Horden. The Georgetown Fire Department was called to the scene and they answered the call quickly, but the man was conscious when they arrived.

Mr. and Mrs. Lieder and their children have only lived in Glen Williams for a month and a half. They had seen the signs prohibiting swimming but believed them to apply to the portion of the river under the bridge.

## Wellington Win

### Gives P-Cs 4 vote

### Margin Over Liberals

Liberal since 1930, Wellington South voted strongly Progressive Conservative Monday when Alfred Hales succeeded the late Henry Hosking as federal member of parliament.

Mr. Hales received 11,806 votes, compared with 6,121 for David Tolton, Liberal and 3,506 for Thomas Withers, CCF.

The election was deferred from June 10 due to the death on June 3rd of Henry Hosking, the Liberal candidate who had held the seat since 1940.

The win gives the Conservatives a 4-vote margin in the House of Commons over the Liberals who have 105 seats plus one Liberal-Labor member who supports the Liberals. The CCF holds 25 seats; Social Credit 18; independent 4. There is a vacancy in Lanark where a by-election will be held on September 9th. Dr. William Blair, Lanark's elected P-C member died a week after his election.

Mr. Hales, 48, a merchant and farmer is a graduate of the Ontario Agricultural College. The last Conservative victory in 1930 was scored by the late Hugh

Guthrie who held the seat for 35 consecutive years, from 1900 to 1930. He was elected four times as a Liberal, once as a wartime unionist and four times as a Conservative.
