Retarded Children's Association Receives Orenda Welfare Gift

Nearly \$28,000 from the Orenda Employees' Welfare Service Fund will be distributed among 29 charitable organizations within the next few weeks.

The first step in the distribution of \$28,740 was made last week with the presentation of a cheque to Gerry Addison, president of the Milton and District Association for Retarded Children. Mr. Addison, who works at the Mallon plant, was presented with the cheque by Spurgeon McBride, the secretary-treasurer of the Orenda Employees' Welfare Service Fund.

Altogether, some \$2,046 will be donated to 13 various branches of the Association for Retarded Children.

The 14 members of the United Appeal will divide \$11,111. Twenty-seven other charities will also receive donations from the Orenda Employees' Welfare Service Fund. Of these, the Salvation Army, \$4,976; Christian Cancer Society,

\$1,056; and various children's aid societies, approximately \$3,500, receive the largest share.
