**Henry Isley, 80 Was Strong Church Worker**

Requiem mass was sung in Holy Cross Roman Catholic Church on Tuesday morning by Father Thomas Van Laer and Father V. J. Morgan for one of the great workers of their congregation, Henry William Isley, of lot 37, concession 6 of Esquesing Township.

Mr. Isley, in failing health since Christmas time, died suddenly on Saturday at his home after returning from a short walk. Born the son of Henry Isley and Mary Besinger Isley eighty years ago in Hessen he attended schools there and it was there he married Alice Harkes in 1904. His wife came from Scotland as a young girl. Thirty-eight years ago Mr. and Mrs. Isley and their family settled in the Glen Williams district where he farmed and for twenty three years of that time was employed at the Provincial Paper Mill as well. After retiring from the mill he worked with Industrial Sand and Gravel until two years ago.

Mr. Isley was an active member of his church and a hard worker for it. In 1930 he made the excavation for the basement and about that time he assisted Father McClure in the clearing and renovating of the Dublin Cemetery.

Mr. Isley is survived by his wife and sons and daughters, Robert, Toronto; Alice (Mrs. Clarence Carey), Georgetown; Mary (Mrs. George Johnson) Toronto; Ann (Mrs. John Holden) Georgetown; Agnes (Peg, Mrs. Gordon Harley) Georgetown, Martha (Mrs. Joseph Hough) Guelph, William, Glen Williams and Joseph, Georgetown.
