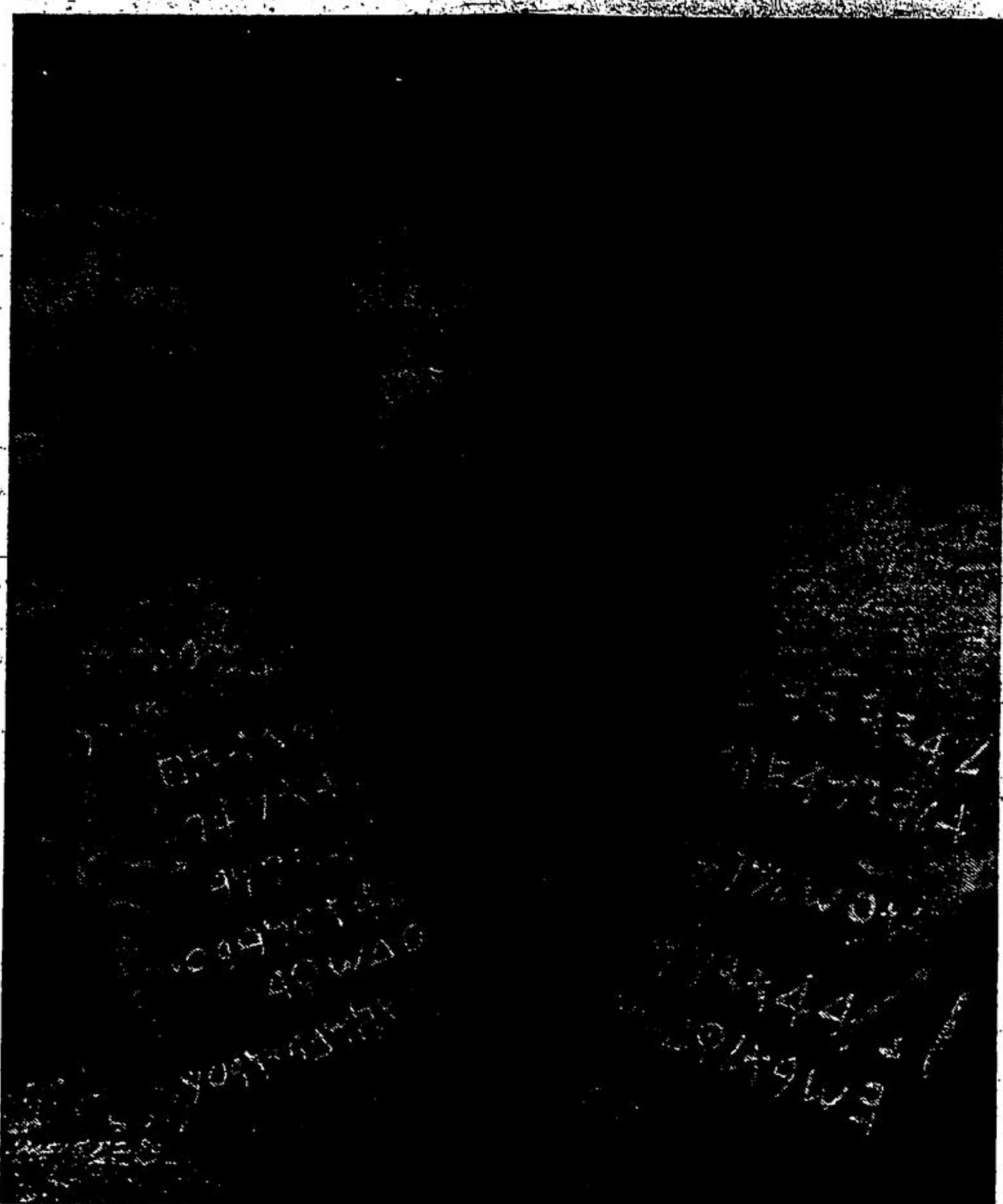

Achievement Day for 4-H Homemaking Clubs

Halton's summer achievement day for "The Club Girl Stands on Guard," brought to a close another worthwhile project for 4-H Homemaking Clubs in the county. Held in the Agricultural building at the Milton fair grounds on Saturday, July 6th, the achievement day had to compete with harness races which had been postponed because of rain during centennial week. The program was none the less successfully carried out by 90 girls from the ten clubs in the county. All members exhibited record

books kept throughout the club as well as charts representing themselves and their homes and showing progress made in personal health and posture, home sanitation and safety. They also prepared and showed first aid kits to be used at home in house, barn or family car.

Mrs. Mabel Borgstrom, county home economist for the Department of Agriculture, was in charge of the day and supervised a morning judging, with oral reasons, a highway safety quiz, and identification of home hazards. Each of these sections was then reviewed and commented on by visiting Home economists, who were Miss Ruth Shaver of Simcoe County; Mrs. Marion Montgomery, Nobleton; and Miss Wilda Gordon, newly appointed Home Economist for the counties of York and Ontario.

Choose Meaford Mayor For C of C Position

Appointment of Robert F. Richardson, of Meaford, as Ontario representative of the Canadian Chamber of Commerce has been announced by General Manager D. L. Morrell. In this post Mr. Richardson will be visiting Boards of Trade and Chambers of Commerce in Ontario, assisting them in their work.

Mr. Richardson comes to the Chamber with a wide background of experience in the business field and in municipal and community work. For the past two years Mr. Richardson has served as mayor of Meaford. His business career has been in the retail hardware trade, and in insurance. He also has been active in the Georgian Bay Development Association, in promoting sports and in service club work. During the war he served overseas with the Grey and Simcoe Foresters Regiment.

Mass X-Ray Reveals 18 TB Cases in Halton County

The Halton County Tuberculosis Association reports that 18 Halton County residents were found to have tuberculosis in the recent mass chest survey. Four of these had active disease and required hospital care. In the 20,927 films made during the survey, there were 347 which revealed abnormalities of the chest.

Dr. Archie F. Bull, medical officer and director of the Halton County health unit, states that "all patients with conditions requiring further follow-up will be examined by their family physicians, or at a chest clinic. All contacts of the active case of tuberculosis will be examined carefully. Only by the most careful vigilance in case finding and follow-up, can we hope to control this important communicable disease."
