**CAR DELIVERY TRUCK CRASH ON MAIN ST. S.**

A collision involving a late model car and a delivery truck on Main Street South last Saturday afternoon resulted in an estimated total \$750 damage to the vehicles, however, both drivers, Ted Burrows of 77 Subway Sideroad, in Streetsville, and Mrs. John Bradshaw, Guelph Street, were uninjured.

The accident occurred at about 1:45 p.m. Mrs. Bradshaw, driving for Bradshaw Flowers, was just backing out of a base at 104 Main Street South when the Burrows car came over the low small hill near the Maple Avenue intersection. Mr. Burrows applied the brakes immediately but was unable to stop in time to avoid the crash.

Most of the damage, \$500 worth, was to the delivery truck. Cpl. Jim Biharron investigated.
