A veteran of the First World War, James McKechnie, died suddenly at his home on Sunday, August 25th, at 30, concession 10 Esquimaux. Sixty-nine years of age he was born in Erin Township the son of the late Alexander and Elizabeth Collins McKechnie and lived in the district all his life in the vicinity of Ballinacra. He attended schools in Erin and later took up the life of a farmer which he worked at until his death. He was a member of the Ballinacra United Church.

Predeceased by his parents and a brother Dan and a sister Bessie he is survived by a sister-in-law Mrs. Dan McKechnie and three nieces, Elva McKechnie, Glen Williams, Noeen Allan, Flora and Norma McDougall of Hillsburgh. HALTON BRED JERSEY MAKES GOOD IN UTAH

Brampton Wellborn Bonnie, a Jersey cow bred by Arthur E. Padbury of Rockwood in Halton County, and sold as a heifer by R. H. Bull and Son, to Smoot Bros. Jersey Farm, Centerville, Utah, has been making Jersey history in that famous state.

Bonnie has completed 8 records, and during that time has been awarded a Ton of Gold certificate. She has done considerable winning in the show-ring, and has 5 records over 700 lbs. of butterfat, and two of these are over 800 lbs. of fat. She has 4 records of over 15,000 lbs. of milk and in her 8 lactations, she has produced 106,670 lbs. of milk and 5,431 lbs. of butterfat. Bonnie is classified Very Good, and she has daughters and granddaughters with records of over 700 lbs. of fat.

In the Don Head Farms herd at Richmond Hill, Ontario, may be seen today the great old cow Roch-alda Volunteer Vivian, by the same sire as Bonnie. Vivian has won many championships, and with her dull sister, Roch-alda Volunteer Violet, has been many time winner of the progeny of dam class, even at fairs like the Royal. Vivian in her lifetime has produced in 8 lactation periods 71,835 lbs. of milk and 4,292 lbs. of fat, and is classified Excellent. She did not go on test until late in life. Last year, at 15 years of age, she produced 9,197 lbs. of milk and 538 lbs. of fat. She has also a Gold Medal record of over 630 lbs. of fat, and is still on test at Don Head.

These great cows are sired by Edgley Wellborn Volunteer, a bull that was unfortunately sent to the butcher's before his greatness was realized. Including his daughter in the U.S., this bull has nine tested daughters.
